ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMITTEES, APPOINTMENTS AND SCHEDULE OF MEETINGS 2012/2013

Summary

This report sets out the position regarding the overall allocation of seats on committees. The Council is asked to make recommendations to the Annual meeting of the Council on 16 May regarding the committees and other bodies to be appointed for 2012/2013 and a programme of meetings.

The Council is also asked to make recommendations to the Joint Meeting of Committees on 16 May 2012, immediately following the Annual Meeting of the Council, in respect of the establishment and membership of sub-committees and task groups.

1. Budget and Policy Framework

- 1.1 The establishment of committees and the appointment of Members to serve on committees and outside bodies is a matter for decision by the Annual Meeting of the Council together with approval of the annual schedule of meetings.
- 1.2 The appointment of Chairmen and Vice-chairmen, the establishment of sub-committees, task groups and the appointment of Members to serve on them is a matter for decision at a Joint meeting of Committees, which immediately follows the Annual Council meeting.

2. Background

- 2.1 In April each year the Council usually considers the position regarding the overall allocation of seats on committees and makes recommendations for decision at the Annual Council meeting in May.
- 2.2 Local elections for all 55 Councillors representing 22 Wards took place on 5 May 2011. Following these elections four political groups were established. The current composition of the Council remains unchanged since the last Annual Council meeting in May 2011 and is as follows:

3 Establishment of Committees and allocation of seats plus other appointments for 2012/2013

- 3.1 The Local Government and Housing Act 1989 requires the Council to allocate seats on committees to political groups in accordance with the size of each group on the Council as a whole, unless alternative arrangements are notified to all Members and agreed without any Councillor voting against them. The council is required to observe the following principles so far as is reasonably practicable:-
 - (a) that not all the seats on the body are allocated to the same political group;
 - (b) that the majority of the seats on the body is allocated to a particular political group if the number of persons belonging to that group is a majority of the authority's membership;
 - (c) subject to paragraphs (a) and (b) above, that the number of seats on the ordinary committees of a relevant authority which are allocated to each political group bears the same proportion to the total of all the seats on the ordinary committees of that authority as is borne by the number of members of that group to the membership of the authority;
 - (d) subject to paragraphs (a) to (c) above, that the number of the seats on the body which are allocated to each political group bears the same proportion to the number of all the seats on that body as is borne by the number of members of that group to the membership of the authority.
- 3.2 Principles (a), (b) and (d) apply to <u>all</u> appointments to the authority's own bodies and to certain outside bodies. However, principle (c) only relates to appointments to the 'ordinary committees' of the council.
- 3.3 Any decision to waive the requirements of political balance will require a resolution of the council with no member voting against.
- 3.4 With the agreement of the Leader of the Council, the Cabinet member for Strategic Development and Economic Growth and the four Group Whips it is proposed to reconstitute the International Relations Committee as a Cabinet Advisory Group in 2012/13. This is as a consequence of a shift of emphasis in the business of the Committee and the consequential need to comply with regulations governing the relevant functions of the Council which are the responsibility of the Cabinet.
- 3.5 In addition it is proposed to create an additional Committee with 8 seats to deal with the appointment to the post of Director of Children and Adults. Given the scope of this post this will enable representation on the

Committee by the two relevant portfolio holders and two Overview and Scrutiny opposition spokespersons from the Labour Group. The Appointments Committee of 6 seats will remain to deal with other senior appointments as set out in the Council's Constitution.

3.6 With these changes the overall number of seats on committees increases from 112 to 115 and the entitlement to seats is as follows:

3.5 The following table sets out proposals (which have been shared with Group Whips), for the establishment of committees, their size and the allocation of seats to political groups. This meets the overriding requirement to ensure the overall number of seats on ordinary committees are allocated in accordance with the political balance of the Council.

Notes:

- (i) There are two additional Conservative Members on the Children and Young People Overview and Scrutiny Committee to preserve that Group's majority in view of the four statutory co-optees with voting rights who have to be appointed to the Committee.
- (ii) The Council has also previously approved the establishment of an ad hoc committee to consider the removal of Council appointed school governors as and when necessary and that the membership of the committee is comprised of the Group Whips and the relevant Portfolio Holder. Previously political balance has been waived in respect of this committee so that the overall number of seats on committees is not affected. Therefore it has not been included in the calculation set out above.
- 3.6 The list of committees, joint committees, outside bodies, sub-committees and task groups are set out at Appendices A and B with recommended sizes and allocation of places.
- 3.7 The Council is asked to note, in particular, that agreement is being sought to reappoint the South Thames Building Control Joint Committee as agreement has been reached between Medway, Gravesham and Swale to continue the building control partnership for a second 5 -year term, effective from September 2012. This Committee is not subject to the rules on political balance.
- 3.8 The Council is also asked to formally agree that Medway should in future nominate only one Trustee to the Sir Joseph Williamson's Mathematical School, instead of four as previously. This is at the request of the Charity following a review of its current constitution and a decision by the Trust to reduce the total number of Trustees. It is understood that existing Trustees nominated by the Council would serve out their current term of office. Group Whips have raised no objection to this.
- 3.9 Finally, the Council will note that it is proposed to reappoint the serving Independent and Parish Council members of the Standards Committee for the remaining life of the Committee pending the introduction of a new standards regime under the Localism Act. In May 2012 Mr Tony Dance, one of the Independent members, will have served on the Committee for two consecutive terms of four years. Standards for England guidance was that Independent Members should not serve more than two four year terms. However as the Committee, as currently constituted, will cease to exist during 2012, the Monitoring Officer recommends that Mr Dance should be re-appointed for this period to provide continuity and avoid the expense of recruiting and training a new Independent member.

4. Timetable of meetings

- 4.1 On 12 January 2012 the Council agreed a draft schedule of meetings for 2012/2013, as attached at Appendix C. Since the Council meeting in January several amendments, as highlighted, have been incorporated into the draft timetable and notified to Group Whips.
- 4.2 Members have suggested reducing the number of Employment Matters Committee meetings and this will be reflected in the schedule of meetings reported to Annual Council on 16 May 2012.

5. Financial, legal and risk management implications

- 5.1 There are no financial implications arising from this report.
- 5.2 The legal position is set out within the body of the report.
- 5.3 There are no risk management implications arising from this report

6. Recommendations

- 6.1 The Council is asked to agree to recommend to Annual Council and the Joint meeting of all Committees on 16 May 2012 as applicable:
 - (i) the establishment of committees, sub committees and task groups, their size and the allocation of seats to political groups as set out in paragraph 3.5 above and in Appendix A, together with terms of reference as set out in the Council's constitution;
 - (ii) that all the serving Independent and Parish Council members of the Standards Committee should be re-appointed for the remaining life of the Committee, noting that Mr Tony Dance has already served on the Committee for two four year terms as set out in paragraph 3.9 of this report
 - (iii) the establishment of an ad hoc committee to consider the removal of Council appointed school governors as and when necessary and to waive political balance in respect of this Committee;
 - (iv) that appointments should be made to Joint Committees, outside bodies and other bodies as set out in Appendix B (with nominees to be reported at the Annual Council meeting);
 - (v) the timetable of meetings for the 2012/2013 municipal year as set out in Appendix C to this report;
- 6.2 The Council is also asked to authorise the Head of Democratic Services to consent to a request from the Trustees of Sir Joseph Williamson's Mathematical School that the Council should in future be able to nominate one person to serve as a Trustee on that Charity instead of four as set out in paragraph 3.8 of this report
