I have reviewed your application to extend the hours of the premises licence for Papa Johns, 70 New Road, Chatham. I do have some concerns over the hours and as a result I would wish to add the following conditions to your licence to counter any potential problems:

After 0030 hours no items of hot food or refreshments will be available for sale from within the premises or for collection.

After 0030 hours all items sold must be delivered to a specified address and not to persons waiting in a street.

I feel that these conditions will promote the licensing objectives by preventing any additional noise from customers in the area and prevent people (particularly those who are intoxicated) hanging around the location of the premises.

I propose these conditions in additional to your already present CCTV conditions which will remain.

I ask that you consider the content of this email and if you are in agreement then please inform me as such by responding to this email, I will ask Medway Council t these conditions to your operating schedule and let them know that Kent Police have no formal representation to make regarding this application.





I am writing to object to the above Application as I believe it contravenes the Medway licensing objectives, as follows:-

THE PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER:

The application to open Papa John's Pizza Take-Away outlet until 03:00am on Friday and Saturday, and 01:00am on Sunday will encourage clients of the OMG nightclub at 3a New Road, Chatham, to remain in the vicinity after the club's closing time of 2am. The club's clients will be traversing the length of Gibraltar Terrace and the homes of local residents to access the Take-Away pizza outlet with the potential to cause noise and public disturbance. There have already been incidents when residents have been roused from sleep because of fights and shouting from clients of the nightclub and the Police have been notified and attended.

Many customers would then be returning along New Road passed Gibraltar Terrace and the homes of local residents to access the railway station and taxicabs, and the bus terminal at the bottom of Maidstone Road. Providing further potential for noise, public disturbance, increased activity levels and traffic generation.

PUBLIC SAFETY & THE PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

With people visiting Papa John's at this time of night after leaving the nightclub it will encourage them to collect outside the Take-Away outlet at the junction of New Road and Old Road with the potential to cause a traffic hazard at the top of the hill.

Customers of Papa John's at this time of night would not be purchasing food to take home but would be consuming it on the street causing the potential for noise, public disturbance and littering.

PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM HARM

Many of the residents of Gibraltar Terrace and New Road, Chatham are families with young children. The potential for the outbreak of fights, shouting and general public disturbance from clients of OMG Nightclub accessing Papa John's Pizza Take-Away outlet in the early hours of the morning would disturb children's sleep and has the potential to be alarming, frightening or even terrifying for them.

I consider that 12.30am is an appropriate closing time for a Take-Away food outlet in a predominantly residential area.

We wish to register our objection to the Premises licence variation.

We object to this application as we believe it is contrary to the Licensing Objectives of Medway Council in that it will compromise public safety, will give rise to public nuisance and will not contribute to preventing crime and disorder. Our grounds for objecting are:

Public safety

- The application means the premises can open from 11am to 3am on Friday and Saturday nights and 1am on Sunday night. No business in this part of the road is open this late and it could impact on the many residents and businesses nearby.
- It is the applicant's intention to attract people to a venue which is situated in a largely residential area and also on a busy main road. Recent experience has seen large numbers of clubbers assemble in the adjacent car park. This appears to be a risk to public safety.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

This venue seeks to attract customers in the early hours of Friday,
 Saturday and Sunday morning. It seems likely it will attract people from
 nearby nightclubs and drinking venues. We note that, unlike a similar
 application from a sandwich shop in Rochester, no proposal is made for
 Security staff and this is of concern given the late night opening hours.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

The proposed licensing hours are from 11am to 3am Friday and Saturday and until 1am on Sunday night. This is a considerable increase on the present time of 11am to 12.30am Friday and Saturday and Sunday until 10.30pm. This will almost certainly cause noise and disturbance to local residents.

Premises Licence Variation for Papa Johns; 70 New Road Chatham

I register my objection to the Premises licence variation.

This is because I believe the application does not meet the Licensing Objectives of Medway Council in that it will compromise public safety, may give rise to public nuisance and will not contribute to preventing crime and disorder. My grounds for objecting are:

Public safety

- The application anticipates that the premises will open from 11am to 3am on Friday and Saturday nights and 1am on Sunday night. No business in this part of the road opens this late and it could impact on the many residents and businesses nearby.
- It is the applicant's intention to attract people to a venue which is situated in a largely residential area and also on a busy main road. Recent experience has seen large numbers of clubbers assemble in the adjacent car park.
- This could attract a number of people arriving either on foot and by vehicles into the early hours of the morning. This take-away venue is situated on the brow of a hill at a challenging bend. To attract more people there in the early hours of the morning appears to be an increased risk to public safety.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

• The proposed licensing hours are from 11am to 3am Friday and Saturday and until 1am on Sunday night. This is a considerable increase on the present time of 11am to 12.30am Friday and Saturday and Sunday until 10.30pm. This will almost certainly cause noise and disturbance to local residents. While I believe it is seeking to attract customers arriving on by foot and by vehicles, I am also opposed to hot food delivery vehicles, including mopeds, leaving this venue when the majority of neighbours will be asleep.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

• This venue seeks to attract customers in the early hours of Friday, Saturday and Sunday morning. It seems likely it will attract people from nearby nightclubs and drinking venues. The majority (64%) of all violence occurs in the evening or at night and one-fifth of all violent incidents take place in or around a pub or club*.

This proposal may be compared to a recent application from a sandwich shop in Rochester. No proposal is made for Security staff and this is of concern given the late night opening hours.

The application anticipates that the premises will open from 11am to 3am on Friday and Saturday nights and 1am on Sunday night. No business in this part of the road opens this late and it will impact on the many residents especially those with young families.

It is the applicant's intention to attract people to a venue which is situated in a largely residential area and also on a busy main road. The last thing my young family need is increased reasons for late night disturbance from drunken pub and club goers.

This could attract a number of people arriving either on foot and by vehicles into the early hours of the morning.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

The proposed licensing hours are from 11am to 3am Friday and Saturday and until 1am on Sunday night.
