1 Summary description of the proposed change

The Council is currently considering options for developing service for people who use the 147 Nelson Road day centre. Options include:

- 1. Maintaining the service as it is
- 2. Amalgamating the service with the Community Outreach Support Service
- 3. Closing the centre but re-providing those with Care Act Eligible needs with personalised support

2 Summary of evidence used to support this assessment

- Eg: Feedback from consultation, performance information, service user records etc.

Evidence has been gathered from the ASC database, visits to the Centre and discussions with the manager and other staff.

All service users have mental health problems.

They are fairly equally spread across all adult age groups.

Of the 38 existing users for whom ethnicity is recorded, 34 are white British, 3 Asian and 1 African.

28 are men and 25 are women.

The service is currently delivered by 4 staff. 1 is man and 3 are women. They range in age from 30 - 60, all are white British and none are disabled.

A period of consultation is proposed that will seek views on the options in section 1. Any feedback received through the consultation, will be used as further evidence to develop this assessment and to support the decision making proposal.

Following consultation, if no appropriate remedial actions were taken, and there was a proposed closure, this would have a detrimental impact on the current user group, all of whom have mental health problems. Their opportunities to undertake daytime social and leisure activities would be reduced and they would lose valuable support.

Use of the centre is well spread across all adult age groups and changes would therefore result in no differential impact related to age.

Also, if changes to the service are proposed this would impact on the 4 current staff. There would be no differential negative impact associated with protected characteristics.
