The legislative requirements the Joint Forward Plan must address are:

- Describing the health services for which the ICB proposes to make arrangements
- Duty to improve quality of services
- Duty to reduce inequalities
- Duty to promote involvement of each patient
- Duty as to patient choice
- Duty to obtain appropriate advice
- Duty to promote innovation
- Duty in respect of research
- Duty to promote education and training
- Duty to promote integration
- Duty to have regard to wider effect of decisions (consider the triple aim)
- Duty as to climate change etc
- Public involvement by integrated care boards
- Addressing the particular needs of children and young persons
- Addressing the particular needs of victims of abuse
- Implementing any joint local health and wellbeing strategy
- Financial duties

In addition, it is recommended the JFP includes:

- Workforce
- Performance
- Digital/data
- Estates
- Procurement/supply chain
- Population health management
- System development
- Supporting wider social and economic development
