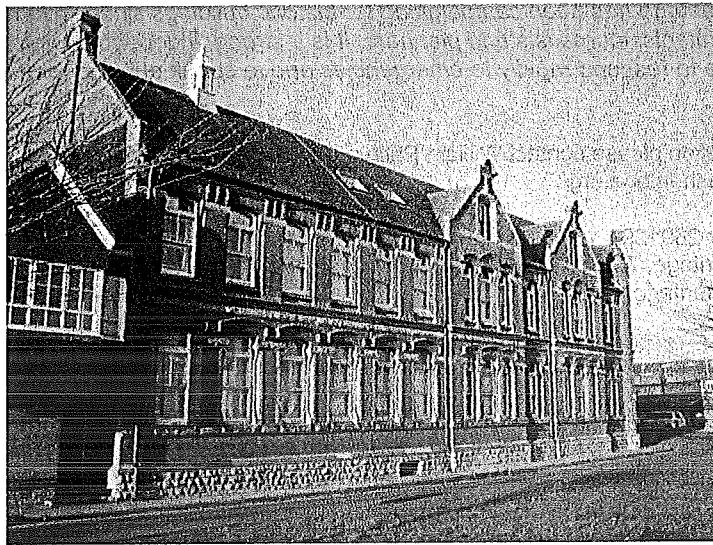

SAVE ATTACKS COUNCIL OVER PLANS TO DESTROY EDWARDIAN LANDMARK



SAVE Britain's Heritage is calling for Medway Council to abandon plans to destroy a landmark Edwardian commercial building occupying a commanding position on the riverside at Strood in north Kent.

The unlisted Aveling and Porter building is one of only a handful of buildings of architectural and historic significance in Strood. It dates c.1906 and was designed by local architect George Bond as the headquarters of Aveling and Porter, manufacturers of agricultural engines. The firm built its first steam engine in 1861 and went on to become the world's leading producer of steam rollers. The firm's handsome office building has stood as a prominent landmark on Strood riverside for over 100 years. Now, the owners, Medway Council, want to see this fine, solid and well-maintained Edwardian building destroyed to facilitate the sale of the wider site to developers.

Although currently empty, the building is in good condition and remarkably intact (all the original windows survive for example). Clearly, it is eminently capable of conversion for a number of new uses. Its waterside location, with views across the Medway to Rochester is a major attraction.

The campaign to save the A&P building has been led by the City of Rochester Society which, on Thursday 30 July, will present a 1000-name petition to councillors. The petition calls for a proper study of potential new uses for the existing building. Suggested options for conversion include a boutique hotel and a new home for the nearby Medway Archive.

Thank you much for your letter dated 27 May regarding the above building. I agree with you that this is a fine building that should be preserved.

From the information that you have provided I think that building is a good candidate for listing; it has forms a handsome street frontage with its characterful detailing around the windows and rusticated stone courses. The corner forming the main entrance is also dealt with in a very pleasing manner. The survival of the grander parts of the interior should help strengthen your case considerably.

As you say, this is an important and well-built part of the industrial heritage of the area by a noted architect. I would be happy to support your campaign to ensure the future of this building. 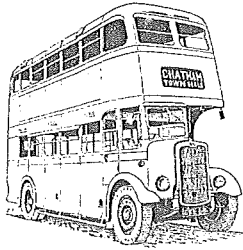

I understand that this building may be under threat of demolition, but also that an alternative proposal is for the building to become a Museum for Medway's industrial heritage.

Friends of Chatham Traction firmly support the latter view. The Medway area has a substantial industrial past ranging from Aircraft to Wharfage and it should certainly be recognised. This example of a George Bond building should remain and could itself feature a recognition of that architect's contribution to the area as part of such a museum.

Our organization aims to demonstrate the contribution of local transport to Medway's economy and community. We aim to restore the sole surviving bus from the Chatham Traction fleet for use as an educational resource. However a local repository for other artifacts and ephemera would allow the full story to be told.

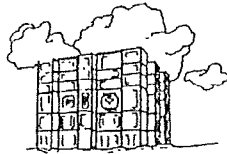

Dear Sirs,

I and my committee were most unhappy to hear of the proposed demolition of the remaining " Aveling and Porter " building in Rochester, and we urge the council to think again about this unhappy proposal.

It is in it's own right an attractive building, by a well known architect, and very pleasing to the eye. Far too many lovely old buildings have already suffered demolition world wide, and much that is unattractive built to replace them.

Also the council should remember the historical significance - Aveling and Porter, builders of steam rollers and traction engines on a large scale, put Rochester on the World map. Their products were exported to almost every country in the world, from America to Iceland, from Argentina to New Zealand, and everywhere inbetween. Thomas Aveling was known as the " father of the traction engine ", in the same way that George Stephenson was known as the " father of the steam railway engine ".

If this planned demolition goes ahead, it will be nothing better then official vandalism, and the town will be the poorer for it. Rochester should be proud of it's industrial heritage instead of sweeping all traces of it away.

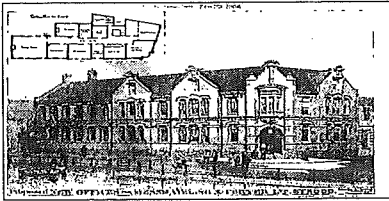
