

I have been in the role of PCSO in Medway for over 12 years. For the past 6 years my beat has

been Rochester High Street. My daily duties are foot patrol in and around the High street liaising

with the local businesses, Cathedral, schools and residents.

The problems I encounter on a daily basis are street drinkers, drug users, beggars. Some of these are homeless and have been offered hostel places which I have been instrumental in securing but they have refused to stay in them as they have more to gain from their nuisance behaviour.

These people impact on the community by causing anti-social behaviour which leads to increased

calls to police.

Rochester High Street and surrounding roads are in an Alcohol Control Zone.

The group of beggars frequent the High Street, sitting on the ground next to ATM machines asking members of the public for money, intimidating and frightening the elderly residents. They also sit in shop doorways making it difficult for customers to enter the shop without giving them something or intimidating them to by alcohol, food, cigarettes etc. Alcohol is readily available due to there being several outlets including pubs and restaurants in the High Street as well as in the surrounding streets. These people can be seen to hover around these outlets causing alarm and distress to other businesses and residents locally.

As the local Police Community Support Officer for Rochester East I have witnessed on several occasions instances where "The City Minimart" on Cazenove Street, Rochester has served super strength lagers and ciders to males who I know to be street drinkers. I have observed street drinkers who have been in an intoxicated state enter City Minimart and exit with cans and bottles of super strength alcohol. They then congregate on the green opposite where they shout abuse at passers-by. Residents as a result feel concerned for their safety, and believe that it brings crime and disorder to the area. I have attended several calls relating to drunk males who have purchased alcohol from City Minimart and have moved them away from the area. The problem is much worse in the summer, where street drinkers cause a public nuisance by leaving litter and letting their dogs

foul the area.
