Summary

This item advises Members of the current work programme and allows the Committee to adjust it in the light of latest priorities, issues and circumstances. It gives Members the opportunity to shape and direct the Committee's activities over the year.

1. Budget and Policy Framework

1.1 Under Chapter 4 – Rules, paragraph 22.1 (v) General terms of reference, each overview and scrutiny committee has the responsibility for setting its own work programme.

2. Background

2.1 Appendix 1 to this report sets out the existing work programme for the Committee.

3. Agenda planning meeting

- 3.1 Members will be aware that Overview and Scrutiny Committees hold agenda planning meetings on a regular basis. These give officers guidance on information that Members wish them to provide when scrutinising an issue. An agenda planning meeting took place on Thursday 22 November 2012.
- 3.2 At the meeting Members requested that at the end of the 2nd, 4th and 6th school terms, officers produce a briefing note providing information on the outcome of school Ofsted inspections and also to update on academy conversions.
- 3.3 Members also requested a briefing note providing an update on the development of the health visiting service.

4. Cabinet Forward Plan

4.1 The latest forward plan was published on 19 November 2012. There are no items on the forward plan that fall within this committee that are not scheduled to

be considered, where it has been agreed at a previous meeting that they will not be considered by the committee or where there is time to consider the item at a future meeting of the committee.

5. Planning for in depth scrutiny reviews for 2013/14

5.1 In June 2011 the Business Support Overview and Scrutiny Committee agreed to exercise a more pro-active role than previously in prioritising the programme of in-depth scrutiny review work in light of a Council decision that a maximum of three reviews or themed meetings can be undertaken annually across all four Overview and Scrutiny Committees. In line with best practice the Committee also decided to adopt a more systematic process for the selection of topics. All four Overview and Scrutiny Committees contributed suggestions for in depth review topics and the current programme of reviews was agreed in September 2011 as follows:

The programming of reviews for the eighteen- month period starting in July 2013 needs to commence early in 2013 to allow time for Overview and Scrutiny members to contribute suggestions for the Business Support Overview and Scrutiny Committee to consider and prioritise. It is therefore proposed to proceed as follows with a view to the proposed programme being submitted to that Committee on 3 April 2013 for approval

- (i) 6 December 2012 to 28 February 2013 Each Overview and Scrutiny Committee to be notified of the timetable and process for determination of the next round of in-depth reviews and invited to agree that members should submit suggestions for topics to Chairmen and Opposition Spokespersons by no later than 28th February taking into account the criteria adopted for the selection of reviews – as set out in the template attached at Appendix 2.
- (ii) March 2013 All Overview and Scrutiny Committee Chairmen and Opposition Spokespersons to meet informally with Officer support to consider and prioritise the list of topics for referral back to Business Support Overview and Scrutiny Committee

(iii) **3 April 2013**: The Business Support Overview and Scrutiny Committee to consider and agree a programme of in depth reviews for the period July 2013 to December 2014.

6. Health Scrutiny

- 6.1 To keep Members of this committee informed about key activities relating to the scrutiny of children's health this section provides an update of recent or forthcoming activity for this committee, the Health and Adult Social Care Overview and Scrutiny Committee (OSC) and the shadow Health and Wellbeing Board.
- 6.2 The Business Support OSC is considering a report at its next meeting on 6
 December 2012 on the review of the Council's overview and scrutiny function
 and e-petitions. The report contains a suggested change to the terms of
 reference of this committee, relating to the scrutiny of children's health. The
 Council has accepted the principle of aligning the scrutiny of health and social
 care in recognition of the importance of integrated service provision. However it
 is being recommended, in the light of experience, that the scrutiny of children's
 health should be moved from this OSC to the Health and Adult Social Care OSC.
 Whilst this committee has reviewed a number of important issues relating to
 children's health this has largely been on a reactive basis as the committee has
 such a wide remit and often NHS scrutiny straddles services for adults and
 children.
- 6.3 The views of the Committee are invited on this suggestion, which may give a sharper focus to issues affecting children's health. If agreed it would be important to involve the members of this Committee (and, in particular Youth Parliament representatives) in any briefings on issues relating to children's health and to ensure that members of the Committee are notified and invited to attend Health and Adult Social Care OSC meetings when children's health is on the agenda. It may also be possible for Group Whips to achieve some duality of membership of both Committees.

7. Implications for Looked After Children

7.1 Scrutinising services and support for looked after children (LAC) is a key aspect of the remit of this committee. Members should ensure they focus attention on the Every Child Matters outcomes for LAC as well as scrutinising every child matters outcomes for all children in Medway.

8. Financial and legal implications

- 8.1 There are no financial implications arising from this report.
- 8.2 Local authorities have power to scrutinise health service in their areas under the Health and Social Care Act 2001. It describes health scrutiny as "reviewing and scrutinising health service matters and making reports and recommendations to NHS bodies on such matters".

9. Recommendations

- 9.1 That, subject to changes made at the meeting, the work programme is agreed as set out at the attached Appendix 1 of the report.
- 9.2 That briefing notes be provided at the end of each 2nd, 4th and 6th school term on the outcome of school Ofsted inspections and academy conversions.
- 9.3 That a briefing note be provided to update the committee on the development of the health visiting service.
- 9.4 That the committee note the proposed timetable and process for determination of the next round of in depth reviews and to agree all members of the Committee should send ideas for topics within the remit of this Committee to the Chairman and Opposition Spokespersons (with a copy to the Head of Democratic Services) by no later than 28th February 2013 having regard to the criteria previously adopted for selection of topics as set out at Appendix 2.
- 9.5 To consider and take a view on a recommendation that the scrutiny of children's health should be transferred from this Committee to the Health and Adult Social Care Overview and Scrutiny Committee on the basis set out in paragraph 6.3 in this report.


