Summary

This item advises Members of the current work programme and allows them to adjust it in the light of latest priorities, issues and circumstances. It gives Members the opportunity to shape and direct the Committee's activities over the year.

1. Budget and Policy Framework

1.1 Under Chapter 4 – Rules, paragraph 22.1 (v) General terms of reference, each overview and scrutiny committee has the responsibility for setting its own work programme.

2. Background

2.1. Appendix 1 to this report sets out the existing work programme for this committee.

3. Agenda planning meeting

- 3.1 Members will be aware that Overview and Scrutiny Committees hold agenda planning meetings on a regular basis. These give officers guidance on information Members wish them to provide when scrutinising an issue. An agenda planning meeting was held on 16 January 2015.
- 3.2 The Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Spokespersons were updated on the Committee's current work programme and advised of the reports to be submitted to this meeting.
- 3.3 At the agenda planning meeting the following changes to the Committee's work programme was proposed:
 - New Rent Setting Policy 2015 item to be moved from "Date to be Determined" to 9 April 2015 meeting.

- 3.4 However, following the agenda planning meeting, the member who initially requested that this item be added to the work programme has agreed that it be removed for the time being. Officers will now work with members to further investigate the issues raised. Subject to Members agreeing to the removal of this item, the current work programme is attached at Appendix 1 for approval by the Committee.
- 3.5 At the agenda planning meeting the Members also discussed actions that were outstanding from previous meetings.

5. The co-ordinating role of the Business Support Overview and Scrutiny Committee

 - pre-budget scrutiny
 - consideration of petitions
 - consideration of called-in Cabinet decisions.

- 8.2 The Task Group on Support for Care Leavers will conclude its work during February and its final report will be submitted to the Children and Young People Overview and Scrutiny Committee on 25 March 2015 and to the Cabinet on 14 April 2015. The reason for the delay is due to the demands on the service following a recent peer review and the desire to ensure that the report is at a high standard to reflect the work the Task Group has undertaken.
- 8.3 Scoping for each new Task Group usually starts at the point the previous Group's final report is submitted to the relevant Overview and Scrutiny Committee. As Task Groups are taking between 4 and 8 months from initial scoping through to a final report being submitted to the Cabinet, (depending on the pace set by Councillors) Members are advised it will not be possible to start and conclude a new Task Group on Housing in Medway before the local elections in May. The option of a Task Group on Housing can be included in the list of prospective topics to be chosen by members for the first round of reviews after the local elections.

9. Recommendations

- 9.1 The Committee is asked to:
 - (a) note and identify items for inclusion in the work programme;
 - (b) agree the changes to the work programme as detailed in paragraph 3.4 and
 - (c) note the work programmes of all overview and scrutiny committees (set out in appendix 2 to this report).
 - (d) Note there will be insufficient time to start and conclude the Task Group on housing in Medway before the local elections on 7 May 2015.
