Delivery and Monitoring

The Medway Strategic Housing Partnership Board was established in 2007 as a forum of key public and private players involved in housing, brought together to help deliver decent and safe homes for all residents living in Medway.

The action plan sets out the actions we will take forward, and each action has a timescale and a target or performance indicator to achieve. Actions may have one or more organisations leading or contributing to its implementation.

The actions are flexible and may alter to meet changing circumstances, but are all based on achieving the vision and priorities. Many actions and projects are well underway and some have already been noted within this strategy.

It is important that the action plan is monitored to ensure that progress is on target, (especially in these changing times), and to ensure that our actions remain the right ones.
