## ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMITTEES, APPOINTMENTS AND SCHEDULE OF MEETINGS 2016/2017

#### **Summary**

This report sets out the position regarding the overall allocation of seats on committees. The Council is asked to approve the recommendations in paragraph 6.1 relating to the committees and other bodies to be appointed for 2016/2017 and a programme of meetings.

The Council is also asked to make recommendations to the Joint Meeting of Committees on 18 May 2016, immediately following the Annual Meeting of the Council, in respect of the establishment and membership of sub-committees and a scrutiny task group.

#### 1. Budget and Policy Framework

- 1.1 The establishment of committees and the appointment of Members to serve on committees and outside bodies is a matter for decision by the Annual Meeting of the Council together with approval of the annual schedule of meetings.
- 1.2 The appointment of Chairmen and Vice-chairmen of some Committees, the establishment of sub-committees, task groups and the appointment of Members to serve on them is a matter for decision at a Joint meeting of Committees, which immediately follows the Annual Council meeting.

#### 2. Background

- 2.1 On 28 April 2016 the Council considered the position regarding the overall allocation of seats on committees and agreed to make recommendations for decision at the Annual Council meeting.
- 2.2 There are 55 Councillors representing 22 Wards. The current composition of the Council is set out below:

### 3 Establishment of Committees and allocation of seats plus other appointments for 2016/2017

- 3.1 The Local Government and Housing Act 1989 requires the Council to allocate seats on committees to political groups in accordance with the size of each group on the Council as a whole, unless alternative arrangements are notified to all Members and agreed without any Councillor voting against them. The council is required to observe the following principles so far as is reasonably practicable:-
  - (a) that not all the seats on the body are allocated to the same political group;
  - (b) that the majority of the seats on the body is allocated to a particular political group if the number of persons belonging to that group is a majority of the authority's membership;
  - (c) subject to paragraphs (a) and (b) above, that the number of seats on the ordinary committees of a relevant authority which are allocated to each political group bears the same proportion to the total of all the seats on the ordinary committees of that authority as is borne by the number of members of that group to the membership of the authority;
  - (d) subject to paragraphs (a) to (c) above, that the number of the seats on the body which are allocated to each political group bears the same proportion to the number of all the seats on that body as is borne by the number of members of that group to the membership of the authority.
- 3.2 Principles (a), (b) and (d) apply to <u>all</u> appointments to the authority's own bodies and to certain outside bodies. However, principle (c) only relates to appointments to the 'ordinary committees' of the council.
- 3.3 Any decision to waive the requirements of political balance will require a resolution of the council with no member voting against.
- 3.4 The overall number of seats on committees is currently 123 allocated across the political groups as follows:

3.5 The following table sets out proposals (which have been shared with Group Whips), for the establishment of committees, their size and the allocation of seats to political groups in 2016/17. This represents no change to the allocation of seats agreed by Annual Council in May 2015 and meets the overriding requirement to ensure the overall number of seats on ordinary committees are allocated in accordance with the political balance of the Council.

#### Notes:

- (i) The three formally constituted political groups qualify for 121 seats as set out in the table above. Two Committee seats will remain unallocated to any political group as indicated in the table. The Independent Member of the Council is not entitled to be allocated any Committee seats unless the Council agrees to do so with no Member voting against.
- (ii) There are two additional Conservative Members on the Children and Young People Overview and Scrutiny Committee to preserve that Group's majority in view of the four statutory co-optees with voting rights who have to be appointed to the Committee.
- (iii) The Council has also previously approved the establishment of an ad hoc committee to consider the removal of Council appointed school governors as and when necessary and that the membership of the committee is comprised of the Group Whips and the relevant Portfolio Holder. Previously political balance has been waived in respect of this committee so that the overall number of seats on committees is not affected. Therefore it has not been included in the calculation set out above
- 3.6 The list of committees, joint committees, outside bodies, sub-committees and task groups are set out at Appendices A and B with recommended sizes and allocation of places.
- 3.7 The Health and Wellbeing Board is listed as a Committee of the Council in Appendix A. This Committee is not subject to the rules on political balance and the Council has previously agreed that the positions of Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Board should be appointed by the Board it its first ordinary meeting after each Annual Council meeting rather than at the Joint meeting of Committees on the evening of Annual Council.

#### 4. Timetable of meetings

4.1 A draft schedule of meetings for 2016/17 is attached at Appendix C. This was considered by the Council at its meeting on 28 April and recommended to Annual Council for approval.

  - (ii) the establishment of an ad hoc committee to consider the removal of Council appointed school governors as and when necessary and to waive political balance in respect of this Committee;

- (iii) The membership of each Committee as set out in Appendix A to this report, including the appointment of voting and non-voting co-optees on Committees as listed
- (iv) that appointments should be made to Joint Committees, outside bodies and other bodies as set out in Appendix B;
- (v) the timetable of meetings for the 2016/2017 municipal year as set out in Appendix C to this report
- 6.2 The Council is asked to recommend to the Joint meeting of Committees:
  - (i) the appointment of Chairmen and Vice Chairmen of Committees as set out in Appendix A to this report;
  - (ii) the establishment of Sub Committees (with terms of reference as set out in the Council's Constitution), one Task Group, their size and the allocation of seats to political groups as set out in Appendix A to this report
