Summary

The applicant has applied for a variation to their existing Premises Licence in respect of Chatham Town Football Club, Maidstone Road Sports Ground, Maidstone Road Chatham, ME4 6LR:

- Increase the opening times
- Licensable activities (both indoors and outdoors)
- License to be extended to cover the extended bar area and the whole ground surrounding the pitch (including the Directors box)

All responsible authorities have been consulted in line with the Licensing Act 2003.

Representations have been received from members of the public and to date no agreements have been reached.

1. Budget and Policy Framework

1.1 Medway Council has published its Statement of Licensing Policy, which it takes into account in all applications relating to the Licensing Act 2003.

2. The application

2.1 In accordance with the Licensing Act 2003, the Council has received an application to vary an existing Premises Licence in respect of Chatham Town Football Club, Maidstone Road Sports Ground, Maidstone Road, Chatham, ME4 6LR.

2.2 Existing licensable activities and times:-

Sale of alcohol (both indoors and outdoors)

Monday to Saturday 10:00 - 23:00

Sunday 12:00 – 22:30

Seasonal

Good Friday 10:00 – 23:00

Christmas Day 12:00 – 15:00 and 19:00 – 22:30

2.3 Variations requested in the application: -

Live Music (both)

Thursday to Saturday 10:00 – 24:00 Sunday 10:00 – 23:00

Recorded Music (both)

Monday to Sunday 10:00 – 24:00

Late night refreshments (both)

Thursday to Sunday 10:00 - 02:00

Supply of alcohol (both)

Monday to Sunday 10:00 - 24:00

Hours the premises are open to the public

Monday to Sunday 10:00 - 24:00

- 2.4 A copy of the application as submitted is at Appendix A.
- 2.5 A copy of the existing premises licence accompanying this application detailing current licensable activities, hours of operation, and conditions is at Appendix B.
- 2.6 The application has been correctly advertised in the local press and notices displayed on the premises for the required period.
- 2.7 A copy of a map showing the location of the premises is at Appendix C.

3. Background

3.1 As stated at paragraph 2 this is an application to vary a current Premises Licence in respect of a change to the licensable hours and activities.

4. Promotion of Licensing Objectives

4.1 The applicant is expected to demonstrate that they have dealt with and understand the promotion of the four licensing objectives, where appropriate. Members are referred to section M of the application at Appendix A and the conditions as set out on the existing licence at Appendix B.

- 4.2 The four licensing objectives are:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder
 - public safety
 - the prevention of public nuisance
 - the protection of children from harm

5. Relevant Representations

5.1 This matter has been put to the Licensing Hearing Panel because the Council has received representations relating to all four of the licensing objectives from members of the public. To date no agreement has been reached. Copies of these are attached at <u>Appendix D</u>.

6. Policy Considerations

- 6.1 Medway Council has published its Statement of Licensing Policy, which it will consider alongside the amended Guidance issued by the Home Office under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 in all applications.
- 6.2 In determining this application, Members may wish to consider information contained in Appendix 4 to the Statement of Licensing Policy that lists examples of good practice against the four licensing objectives as well as Chapters 9 and 10 of the amended Guidance.
- 6.3 The objections raised in the relevant representations received relate all four licensing objectives.

7. Risk Management

7.1 The Council has to consider and determine this application, which is a function relating to licensing and registration as set out in Schedule 1 to the Functions Regulations, the Licensing Act 2003. Gambling Act 2005 and other licensing functions reserved by law to the Council's Licensing and Safety Committee and its Sub-Committees, in accordance with the law (both statutory and case law), relevant statutory guidance and statements of policy.

8. Financial and legal implications

- 8.1 There are no direct financial or legal implications at this time.
- 8.2 This hearing is regulated by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 (as amended).
- 8.3 There is the possibility of a challenge by way of appeal to the decision by either the applicant or objectors should either have the requisite grounds to do so. Legal advice will be given to members as appropriate at the meeting. However, whatever the decision of the Panel, this must be based on the evidence placed before it in line with the licensing objectives and the Panel must decide what weight to attribute to this information.

9. Recommendation

9.1 That the Licensing Hearing Panel, having regard to Licensing Act 2003, the statutory guidance issued under S182, the Council's Licensing Policy and all matters before it, both written and oral, considers and determines the application to vary the premises license.







FORMAL OBJECTION TO VARIATION OF PREMISES LICENCE. CHATHAM TOWN FOOTBALL CLUB, MAIDSTONE ROAD SPORTS GROUND, MAIDSTONE ROAD, CHATHAM, KENT

LICENCE REFERENCE; MEDWAY-05-PREM-0253

Dear Sir/Madam

I wish to register my formal objection to the application for variation in licence at Chatham Football Club, specifically

- The extension of the current licence to allow live music/DJ in & out of doors from 10am midnight, Thursday Saturday and 10am 11pm on Sunday
- The extension of the current licence to allow the serving of alcohol in the bar area, the directors box and in the football club grounds from 10am - 2am, Thursday -Sunday and from 10am - midnight, Monday - Wednesday.

My objection is based upon several points relating to Medway Council Licencing Objectives:

REF: MEDWAY-05-PREM 0253

PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

Noise

Bournville Avenue, which runs immediately adjacent to Chatham Football Ground, is a quiet residential area with very little vehicle or pedestrian traffic during the day, at night or in the early hours. The quiet nature of the area is a feature that attracts people to live here.

The proposed variation to permit outdoor live music/DJ until midnight on 3 consecutive days and 11pm on the 4th consecutive day could have a significant adverse effect on the well-being of local residents. Noise from the venue could seriously disrupt the lives and sleeping patterns of both adults and children which, if happening on a regular basis (4 nights out of 7), could significantly impact on both work productivity and education. It is well established that undisturbed sleep is vital for the physical and mental health of both children and adults. The stress that can be associated with chronic, persistent or re-occurring noise should not be underestimated.

In addition to amplified noise (live or recorded), there will also be noise as customers enter & leave the venue. People who congregate outside in order to smoke will inevitably make noise. If alcohol has been consumed they may be less mindful of their behaviour, language and volume. In the warmer summer months when people are more likely to congregate outside, local residents will likely need to keep windows shut which could further impact on their comfort and well-being in their own homes.

The application requests an alcohol extension from 10am until midnight on 3 consecutive nights and until 2am on 4 consecutive nights. This in itself already comprises 85% of the hours in a week. In reality, residents including myself could be exposed to customers arriving and leaving, consuming alcohol and generating noise beyond those hours as customers may not always arrive or leave promptly.

In addition to human noise there is likely to be an increase in vehicle noise as customers arrive and leave.

I am concerned that an extension for out of doors live music/DJ until midnight is being considered, when Medway council guidelines recommend closing outside areas gardens at 11pm.

Lights

The football ground floodlights are very powerful but are currently used infrequently. Extending the licence to include the outside space would inevitably involve regular use of outside lighting which would contribute to light pollution and impact on the living environment of myself and other local residents.

Rubbish & litter

Based on observation of other venues, it is highly likely that people congregating outside to smoke will drop cigarette butts and potentially other litter including empty cigarette packets, glasses or bottles.

Community Safety

I am concerned that the availability of alcohol for between 14 and 16 hours every day until the early hours of the morning would significantly increase the risk of antisocial behaviour, disturbance, damage to personal property and damage to the local surroundings including the public park adjacent to the football ground.

Due to limited parking at the football ground, surrounding roads are likely to be used for car parking. This could also impact on local residents who drive to the sports ground to use the park or tennis courts. There is the risk that this could cause both inconvenience (such as parking across driveways or boxing-in) or a hazard (narrowing pathways and restricting access, increased traffic flow and risk of accidents).

THE PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER

As highlighted above, I am concerned that the extension of licence hours would increase the risk of antisocial behaviour, disturbance, damage to personal property and damage to the local surroundings including the public park adjacent to the football ground.

PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM HARM

Chatham Football Club is located in a residential area immediately adjacent to a well-used park that is popular with local youth football teams and families with young children. Extending licence hours from 10 am and to include locations within the football ground to include the outside areas around the pitch will potentially expose young people playing in the park to factors associated with excessive alcohol consumption such as strong language, sexual expletives, inappropriate and potentially aggressive or criminal behaviour. As the parent of a young child I am concerned about this.

In summary, the terms of the proposed variation to licence would have a significant impact on the character of the immediate local area and on my physical and mental well-being. I therefore oppose the variation to licence. I would appreciate being kept informed as the application progresses.

OBJECTION TO VARIATION OF PREMISES LICENCE AT; CHATHAM TOWN FC, MAIDSTONE ROAD SPORTS GROUND, MAIDSTONE RD, CHATHAM PREMISES LICENCE NUMBER: MEDWAY-05-PREM-0253

I am writing in relation to the above application and to register my objection for this application.

The basis for this opposition is that granting a variation on the licence for these premises will not promote the licensing objectives, particularly the prevention of public nuisance.

Noise from live music / DJ's would greatly affect the lives of myself and residents in the immediate vicinity by extending the licence out of doors and from 10 am until midnight on three consecutive days - Thursday, Friday, Saturday and from 10 am until 11 pm on a Sunday. Noise from the tannoy system on every day from 10 am until midnight would again be detrimental to residents in the immediate vicinity.

I object to the provision to extension of serving alcohol from 10am until 2am on four consecutive evenings - Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday in the bar area, directors box and around the ground of the football club will cause noise being emitted from the ground.

I also object to the extension of the licence for the extension for the supply of alcohol on all nights until midnight. By granting the extension to the licence the neighbourhood would suffer from noise, disturbance and anti-social behaviour because of the noise from events and with customers arriving/leaving.

The area, which is a built up residential neighbourhood, is normally very quiet during the evening and early hours of the morning and in particular any arrivals or departures after midnight will cause a disturbance. I am also concerned about the potential for damage to property if customers are allowed to leave in the early tours of the morning, having drunk significant quantities of alcohol and also to the level of noise that this would create.

I would therefore like to reiterate that granting the extension would have a detrimental effect on both myself and the neighbourhood.

CHATHAM TOWN FOOTBALL CLUB LICENCE APPLICATION

It is the council's policy to lock parks after sunset to deter unsociable practices and behavior.

Should the said application be successful the Maidstone Road/ Bournville Avenue park would remain open until 2pm with no guarantees the park would be secured thereafter, regardless of obligations, as is found now.

In such circumstances, be under no illusion an open gate policy until the early hours would be soon exploited by those wishing to undertake unsociable practices. In recent months there have been two fires on the periphery of the football ground with the fire services in attendance on one occasion. The defibrillator housing placed for emergency use by the tennis courts was vandalised and the defibrillator stolen. The park has had these and more minor issues after dark. I ask you as a group to not exasperate the situation by the granting of this licence and for you to undertake a duty of care to those who live within the proximity of the park and football ground.

My other objections have already been raised in a previous letter.
