LICENSING ACT 2003 APPLICATION TO VARY AN EXISTING PREMISES LICENCE

COOLING CASTLE BARN, COOLING CASTLE, COOLING, ROCHESTER, KENT ME3 8DT

Summary

The applicant has applied to vary the premises licence for Cooling Castle Barn, Cooling Castle, Cooling, Rochester, Kent ME3 8DT.

The application is to request a variation to condition 15 of the existing licence, which relates to the use of the outside area. The amendment is sought in order to provide a safe area for smokers after 23:00 hours and to reduce potential neighbourhood disturbances from patrons leaving the premises altogether in order to smoke (further details are set out in Section M of the application)

All responsible authorities have been consulted in line with the Licensing Act 2003.

Representations have been received from a member of the public and Environmental Protection in relation to public nuisance. To date, no agreements have been reached.

No further representations have been received from members of the public or other responsible authorities.

1. Budget and Policy Framework

1.1 Medway Council has published its Statement of Licensing Policy, which takes into account in all applications relating to the Licensing Act 2003.

2. The current application

- 2.1 In accordance with the Licensing Act 2003, the Council has received an application for a variation of the licence in respect of Cooling Castle Barn, Cooling Castle, Cooling, Rochester, Kent ME3 8DT.
- 2.2 The details of the variation to the licence are as follows:

The application is to request a variation that condition 15 of the existing licence be amended to read: "Outdoor areas are not to be used after 23:00 (11:00 pm) Monday to Sunday, save for access, egress and the use of the marked smoking area (hatched red on the attached plan and paved at the premises) for up to 30 smokers at a time. The smoking area is to be monitored by at least one staff member at all times it is in use after 23:00. Customers will not be allowed to take drinks to the smoking area after 23:00"

The amendment is sought in order to provide a safe area for smokers after 23:00 and to reduce potential neighbourhood disturbances from patrons leaving the premises altogether in order to smoke (further details are set out in Section M of the application)

- 2.3 A copy of the application as submitted is at Appendix A.
- 2.4 A copy of the current licence is attached at Appendix B.
- 2.5 The application has been correctly advertised in the local press and notices displayed on the premises for the required period.
- 2.6 All responsible authorities have been consulted in line with the Licensing Act.
- 2.7 A copy of a map showing the location of the premises is at Appendix C.

3. Promotion of Licensing Objectives

- 3.1 The applicant is expected to demonstrate that they have dealt with the promotion of the four licensing objectives, where appropriate. Members are referred to Section M of the application at <u>Appendix A</u> where the applicant has referred to this issue.
- 3.2 The four licensing objectives are:
 - The prevention of public nuisance
 - Prevention of crime and disorder
 - Public safety
 - Protecting children from harm

4. Relevant Representations

4.1 This matter has been put to the Licensing Hearing Panel because the Council has received representations from a member of the public and Environmental Protection relating to Public Nuisance. To date no agreement has been reached. Copies are attached at Appendix D.

5. Policy Considerations

- 5.1 Medway Council has published its Statement of Licensing Policy, which it will consider alongside the amended Guidance issued by the Home Office under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 in all applications.
- 5.2 In determining this application, Members may wish to consider information contained in Appendix 4 to the Statement of Licensing Policy that lists examples of good practice against the four licensing objectives as well as Chapters 9 and 10 of the amended Guidance.

6. Risk Management

6.1 The Council has to consider and determine this application, which is a function relating to licensing and registration as set out in Schedule 1 to the Functions Regulations, the Licensing Act 2003, the Gambling Act 2005 and other licensing functions reserved by law to the Council's Licensing and Safety Committee and its Sub-Committees, in accordance with the law (both statutory and case law), relevant statutory guidance and statements of policy.

7. Financial and legal implications

- 7.1 There are no direct financial or legal implications at this time.
- 7.2 This hearing is regulated by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 (as amended).
- 7.3 There is the possibility of a challenge by way of appeal to the decision by either the applicant or objectors should either have the requisite grounds to do so. Legal advice will be given to Members as appropriate at the meeting. However, whatever the decision of the Panel, this must be based on the evidence placed before it in line with the licensing objectives and the Panel must decide what weight to attribute to this information.

8. Recommendation

8.1 That the Licensing Hearing Panel, having regard to Licensing Act 2003, the statutory guidance issued under S182, the Council's Licensing Policy and all matters before it, both written and oral, considers and determines the application for a premises licence.

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

It is only the relatively small outside area hatched red on the accompanying plan ("the outside area") which will be used for smoking. Such an area can be relatively easily policed, and patrons will not be outside in any other areas (other than to leave the premises). It is necessary to create such an area, otherwise there will be no facilities for smoking after 23:00, and patrons are likely to leave the premises to smoke, causing danger to themselves and road users (by moving to the perimeter of the premises where there is a busy rural road with limited lighting), and creating more noise by being in areas which are unsupervised.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The Applicant provides SIA door security from 9.00pm onwards when functions are taking place.

CCTV is installed throughout the premises, and recordings are kept for 31 days.

No patrons are permitted to take drinks outside after 23:00.

Any person selling or supplying alcoholic drink under the authority of a personal licence holder asks for photographic proof of age where they have reason to suspect that any individual consuming that may be under 18 years of age.

A customer dispersal policy is maintained and adhered to whilst the venue is operational.

c) Public safety

The Applicant provides SIA door security from 9.00pm onwards when functions are taking place.

Escape routes and exits, including external exits, are maintained to ensure that they are not obstructed, in good order with non-slippery and even surfaces, free of trip hazards and clearly identified.

Adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials are available on the premises. Free drinking water is available at all times the premises is open to the public.

Due to the nature of Cooling Castle Barn's location, there is no safe place beyond the properties perimeter for guests to smoke without being subjected to unacceptable levels of moving traffic coming from multiple directions.

The creation of an onsite smoking area, will immensely improve public safety after 23.00.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

A noise management policy is maintained and adhered to at all times the venue is operational. This contains measures specific to mitigating public nuisance.

No consumption of alcohol in the outside area will be permitted after 23:00. Furthermore, a maximum of 30 people will be allowed in the outside area at any one time. This will be policed by the door supervisors who are present. It is submitted that the creation of an outside area to allow individuals to smoke does in fact assist in the prevention of public nuisance since it stops individuals from moving off the premises to smoke (and therefore potentially causing more noise to neighbours), and also reduces the volume of pedestrian traffic by the roads (since individuals may walk to the perimeter of the premises to smoke if they cannot do so on the premises).

Creating the specific outside area for smoking after 23:00 means that all entrances and exits from the Great Barn are via the fire exit and porch doors, and therefore the use of the double doors greatly reduces the risk of any internal noise from individuals or recorded music travelling to nearby residential properties.



Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

Condition 1

No supply of alcohol maybe made under this licence:-

- (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of it or
- (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.

Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Condition 2

Only individuals licensed by the Security Industry Authority (SIA) maybe used at the premises to guard against:-

- (a) Unauthorised access or occupation (e.g. through door supervision)
- (b) Outbreaks of disorder
- (c) Damage

Condition 3

- (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale of supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises
 - (a) Games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to
 - (i) Drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol) or
 - (ii) Drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise)

- (b) Provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) Provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) Selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) Dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

Condition 4

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it reasonably available.

Condition 5

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature

Condition 6

The responsible person must ensure that:-

- (a) Where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:-
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
- (b) These measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) Where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Condition 7

- (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price, which is less than the permitted price.
- (2) For the purpose of the condition set out in paragraph 1:-
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(6);

- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula: $P = D + (D \times V)$ where:
 - (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence:-
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994(7)
- (3) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph (2) would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (4) (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph (2) on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

Condition 8

Noise limiter installed and maintained and set at levels agreed by Environmental Health

Condition 9

Internal and external CCTV to be installed and maintained with an incorporated recording facility. Tapes to be stored for an appropriate period of time (generally one month – but to be agreed with the Police and Licensing Authority). The CCTV system to be fully operational throughout the hours that the premises are open for any licensable activity. CCDTV recordings to be produced to Licensing Authority and Police on request.

Condition 10

No Karaoke will take place on the premises.

Condition 11

Deliveries are only to be allowed up to 12:00 (noon)

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

Condition 12

When regulated entertainment, which generates significant noise, is taking place, doors and windows will be kept shut.

Condition 13

Reproduced or live music is to be set at a level so as not to be audible at the façade of the nearest residential property.

Condition 14


The Designated Premises Supervisor, duty Manager or relevant person should assess noise levels on a regular basis to prevent excessive breakout.



On behalf of the Holland family I would like to object to the application to vary the premises licence for Cooling Castle Barn on the grounds that this being an additional Public Nuisance to the local area and residents, which particularly impacts on the Holland family.

Any thoughts of granting this variation will add to the ongoing burden experienced by residents.

Medway Council already have a large dossier of the environmental impacts of various disturbances including diary notes, audio recordings and reports from your council officers including noise junruly behaviour on a regular basis which includes outbreaks of disturbance after 11pm in outside areas which should not occur under existing operating conditions. This has been going on for many years now. Cooling Castle Barn are already operating under a suspended hearing notice from action brought by Medway Council. Any specific area for people being funnelled towards after 11pm will lead to even more late night noise outbursts ,especially when under the influence of alcohol.

For a variation notice to be sought now also indicates that there appears to be no fears or qualms about them overturning the council's objections to their current operating conditions and consideration to the negative impact that this will add to residents.

Hi,

I have reviewed the variation application to enable the outside area to be used from 23.00 – 23.30 hours Sun – Thurs and 23.00 - 00.30 hours on Fri and Sat. Following discussions with Environmental Protection we have decided to object to this application under the licensing objective for the prevention of public nuisance, for the following reasons;

The locality is in a small village in a rural area where there are no pavements and no street lights with a negligible background noise. The impact of noise from patrons in the outside area on residents will be exacerbated by an extension of the hours of use of the outside area to those shown above.

A complaint for noise nuisance has been received by EP and investigated. This has resulted in a noise abatement notice being served on 29 June 2017 under EPA s80 for the following: noise from amplified and non-amplified music, patrons, vehicles, extractor type fan and air compressor. The Notice is currently under appeal at Medway Magistrates Court. Granting permission for this application, prior to a decision by the Magistrates, may have negative repercussions for Medway Council with the appeal case. The court date set for the appeal decision is the 21/02/2018.

Should the panel decide to grant permission for the outside area to be used from 23.00 – 23.30 hours Sun – Thurs and 23.00 - 00.30 hours on Fri and Sat, I would recommend the following conditions to negate the impact of noise from the premises;

- No drinks will be allowed in the smoking area all drinks to remain inside.
- Limit the number of patrons allowed outside in the smoking area to a maximum of five.
- The use of door staff to enforce licensing agreements.
- Small bar area to remain open until the end of the event to provide a 'quiet area' offering an alternative area for patrons rather than outside of the venue.
- Patrons to remain inside of the venue while waiting for taxis, door staff/venue staff to meet and greet taxis and inform patrons that their taxi has arrived.
- Windows and doors to remain closed.
