OUTCOMES OF HOUSING BENEFIT COUNTER FRAUD INVESTIGATIONS

Report from: Internal Audit

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Summary

To inform Members of progress in investigating allegations of housing and council tax benefit fraud. This report covers activity during the quarter ending 31 December 2009.

1. Budget and Policy Framework

1.1 Following the Council's decision to establish this committee, it is within the remit of this committee to take decisions regarding accounts and audit issues.

2. Background

- 2.1 Medway Council has had a sanction policy since 2002 (revised in 2006) following changes to the way benefit investigations should be conducted. These changes resulted in a more rigorous investigative standard being adopted which lead to specific outcomes, known as sanctions. Namely, that local authorities should consider the use of one of the following courses of action following a successful investigation:-
 - Prosecution
 - Issue of a caution
 - Issue of an administrative penalty (fine).

3. Outcomes of Investigations

3.1 In this financial year to 31 December 2009, the investigations team has identified £400,274 of fraudulent overpayments of Housing and Council Tax Benefit and £418,787 of DWP paid benefits.

- 3.2 In the quarter to 31 December, there have been 13 successful prosecutions, 2 unsuccessful prosecutions, 4 cautions and 2 administrative penalties issued. These sanctions are detailed at Annex A.
- 3.3 The following table shows the progress of current cases following a decision to prosecute.

9821 & 10500	Key witness wavering on evidence provided in witness statement. Legal advice is that witness is unreliable and case against partner is likely to fail. Withdrawal of proceedings against partner also weakens case against claimant. Prosecution action against both claimant and partner ceased.			
9777	Joint investigation with DWP as lead. Claimant was interviewed in September 2009 Claimant appealed against DWP "living together" decision. DWP policy then was to hold back prosecution action if an appeal had been lodged. However, during the appeal process DWP policy changed to continue prosecution action in such cases. Regrettably, in this case the papers were not put in front of the DWP's legal branch and by the time they reviewed the case there was a significant delay between IUC and prosecution progress. The prosecution case was withdrawn.
