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Summary

This report advises Members of the current work programme and allows them to adjust it in the light of latest priorities, issues and circumstances and provides an opportunity to shape and direct the Committee's activities over the year.

1. Budget and Policy Framework

1.1 Under Chapter 4 – Rules, paragraph 21.1 (xv) General terms of reference, each overview and scrutiny committee has the responsibility for setting its own work programme.

2. Background

2.1 Appendix 1 to this report sets out the existing work programme for this Committee. One of the Committee's functions is to provide guidance and leadership on the development and co-ordination of the scrutiny function for all Overview and Scrutiny Committees. Appendix 2 sets out the work programmes for the other Overview and Scrutiny Committees.

3. Agenda Planning Meeting

- 3.1 Members will be aware that Overview and Scrutiny Committees hold agenda planning meetings on a regular basis. These give officers guidance on information Members wish them to provide when scrutinising an issue. Following consultation with the Chairman and Opposition Spokesperson, the agenda planning meeting did not take place on this occasion.
- 3.2 At agenda planning meetings Members regularly review actions agreed at previous meetings of the Committee which are still outstanding. The Chairman and Opposition Spokesperson have reviewed the current list of outstanding actions and agreed that many are no longer relevant and therefore not needed except for: a request that specialist advice on the governance arrangements

for Medway Commercial Group be shared with Members and also that levels of income across all Council car parks be investigated in order to help inform future decision on levels of charges.

- 3.3 However, as some of these actions relate to requests for briefing notes agreed by the Committee, Members are asked to formally agree that briefing papers on the following issues are no longer required:
 - Chatham Bus Station ticket office.
 - Discretionary Rate Relief for charities.
 - A breakdown of the £1.8m of spend identified by the Category Management team that the Council could stop spending, reduce its supply chain or tender to achieve savings.
 - More detail in response to questions about the distribution of VIP and complimentary match day tickets agreed as part of the sponsorship agreement between the Council and Gillingham Football Club.
 - The Homelessness Reduction Act, the number of children in temporary accommodation and the numbers of people on the housing register classified as Band X.
 - Details of the non-recurrent actions totalling £1.27m identified to partially address the pressures confronting Front Line Services.
 - Staffing levels at leisure centres.
 - The history behind the series of mercury abatement works in the capital programme.
 - The percentage of Medway Norse's income generated from non-Council business.

4. Forward Plan

4.1 The current Forward Plan of forthcoming Cabinet decisions was published on the Council's website on 11 March.
