Summary

This report updates Cabinet with regard to the acquisition of land for a secondary Free School in Strood.

1. Budget and Policy Framework

1.1 Cabinet has responsibility, pursuant to a statutory duty, to provide sufficient school places.

2. Background

2.1 Cabinet at its meeting on 5 March 2019, approved the underwriting of an 'overage' provision on the terms set out below:

Decision: 44/2019

The Cabinet approved the underwriting of the overage held against the Manor Barn land in Strood, as set out in the Exempt Appendix.

Decision: 45/2019

The Cabinet agreed that the legal agreement is in a format agreed by the Chief Legal Officer, in consultation with the Leader and Portfolio Holders for Children's Services (Lead Member) and Resources.

Reasons:

Approving the underwriting of the overage will enable the Department for Education (DFE) to agree a land acquisition with the owners of the Manor Barn site, and is a low risk high reward strategy which will provide a site for the construction of a secondary Free School, to help meet increasing demand in Medway, with all construction costs met by the DFE.

- 2.2 After the Chief Legal Officer had consulted the Leader and Portfolio Holders for Children's Services (Lead Member) and Resources, who had confirmed their support for the completion of the relevant agreement but before actual completion, a material fact came to light.
- 2.3 Lawyers representing the DfE confirmed late on the afternoon of 27 March 2019, the day before the proposed completion of the legal agreements, that the period of the overage was not in fact operational until 2033, but 2043.

3. Options

- 3.1 The Chief Legal Officer re-consulted the three named Cabinet Members. He advised that the Council had agreed a right of pre-emption which had now been extended to 2043. He further advised that on that basis the longer date did not materially impact on the risks associated with this decision.
- 3.2 Members considered the option of not proceeding to underwrite the overage but recommended that completion could proceed, therefore, the Chief Legal Officer completed the agreement in accordance with decision no. 45/2019 set out above, on 28 March 2019.
