# **WORK PROGRAMME**

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## Summary

This item advises Members of the current work programme and allows the Committee to adjust it in the light of latest priorities, issues and circumstances. It gives Members the opportunity to shape and direct the Committee's activities over the year.

# 1. Budget and Policy Framework

1.1 Under Chapter 4, Part 5 of the Constitution – Overview and Scrutiny Rules, paragraph 21.1 (xv) General terms of reference, each overview and scrutiny Committee has the responsibility for setting its own work programme.

# 2. Background

2.1 Appendix 1 to this report sets out the proposed work programme for the Committee during the current municipal year.

# 3. Agenda planning meeting

- 3.1 Members will be aware that Overview and Scrutiny Committees hold agenda planning meetings on a regular basis. These give officers guidance on information that Members wish them to provide when scrutinising an issue. An agenda planning meeting took place on 11 September 2019.
- 3.2 At the meeting, Members discussed the recent Ofsted Inspection and how progress could be scrutinised. It was proposed to add updates on the progress being made following the inspection to the January 2020 and March 2020 meetings.
- 3.3 It was also suggested that the Portfolio Holder for Children's Services (Lead Member) be invited to attend the meeting on 3 October 2019 (this meeting), which was considering a report on the findings of the inspection and action completed and proposed. Furthermore, the Portfolio Holder or the External

Chair of the Improvement Board (yet to be identified and appointed) should also be invited to attend the January 2020 meeting. This would be discussed further at a future agenda planning meeting.

- 3.4 At the meeting Members also agreed to defer the following two reports to the December meeting, the work programme at Appendix 1 has been updated accordingly:
  - Regional Adoption Agency
  - Update on Children's Services 0-19 contract delivered by Medway Community Healthcare
- 3.5 In addition, it has been suggested that an update on the Children and Young People Mental Health and Emotional Wellbeing Service also be reported to the December meeting.
- 3.6 Following the meeting the latest Forward Plan (published on 23 September 2019 as detailed in section 4 of this report) included an entry regarding the outcome of consultation on proposals to restructure Alternative Provision in Medway. It is proposed that this be reported to this Committee on 3 December 2019 as pre-decision scrutiny.

#### 5. Petition

- 5.1 The Committee should note that the Council received an e-petition requesting the Council to stand with the parents of Wainscott Primary School who were seeking to revoke the Department for Education academy order.
- 5.2 The Lead Petitioner subsequently requested to withdraw the petition as it came to a close. However, as the petition had been signed by approximately 30 people, officers still provided a response to the petition, which is set out below.
- 5.3 Officers explained that the school's recent Ofsted Inspection Report raised a number of serious concerns in respect of safeguarding and progress for disadvantaged pupils and placed the school into a category. In circumstances relating to safeguarding concerns, the Secretary of State has the power to make an Academy Order. Following the decision of the Secretary of State to issue such an order, the Regional Schools Commissioner (RSC) undertook a process to seek an Academy Trust with the necessary skills and experience, to take over the running of Wainscott Primary School and for the school to become part of that trust.
- 5.4 The RSC communicated with the parents of the School and the new provider held an open evening for parents setting out the plans and timescale moving forward. The new academy provider took over the running of Wainscott Primary School in early September. The response also confirmed that Medway Council has no power to stop an Academy Order issued under these circumstances.

# 5. STP Briefing on NHS Local Five Year Plan

- 5.1 A Member Briefing has been arranged in relation to the Kent and Medway Five Year Plan. In response to the NHS Long Term Plan published in January 2019, the Kent and Medway Sustainability and Transformation Partnership (STP) are required to develop a five-year plan that sets out how to bring the ambitions of the Long Term Plan to life in Kent and Medway. The briefing session will provide Members with an overview of the whole plan and will then focus on parts of the plan concerned with developing primary and community care and personalised care services.
- As this Committee has the scrutiny of children's health issues within its remit, the briefing will be of particular interest. The briefing is scheduled to be held on 29 October 2019 at 6:30pm in Meeting Room 9 and all Members of the Committee are encouraged to attend.

#### 6. Implications for Looked After Children

6.1 Members should ensure they focus on outcomes for looked after children. This includes considering their physical health; their emotional health; their safeguarding; their educational attainment and progress; their hopes and aspirations for their adult lives and how looked after young people have their voices heard. We know that looked after children can be more vulnerable to sexual exploitation so particular attention should be given to this. As a corporate parent, Members should be a champion for looked after children and have the same high expectations of them as they would for their own child, grandchild or niece/ nephew.
