THRIVING

Empower families to be resilient and economically secure

Have fun growing up and have a voice

• 75% of Medway Levy payers utilising levy to recruit apprentices or for transfer by 2024

- 624 Cases stepped down from CSC (under 18 years old)
- 33% Initial Early Help Assessments completed within 20 working days of referral
- 85% Child & Family Assessments completed within 45 days
- 70% of LAC in care in the same placement for more than 2 years
- 247 Rate of First-Time entrants to the youth-justice system aged 10-17 (per 1000,000 population)
- 108 8-24 Year Olds worked with by the Youth Services Participation
 Team
 - 90% of LAC who have participated in reviews
- 2800 YP attending Youth Services activities aged between 8-24

- 75% of children and young people showing improvement after

 doing a weight management course.
 - 34% Excess weight in 10-11-year olds
- 23.3% of children with one or more obviously decayed, missing (due to decay) and filled teeth
- 92% under 18 weeks to access Children's Mental Health Services
 - 6.6% post 16 young people with an EHCP not in education,
 employment or training.
 - 59.9% of 15 year olds in Medway report high life satisfaction
 - 74% of childminders with Good or Outstanding Ofsted Judgements
- 71% of five-year olds have achieved a good level of developmen
 - 21.5% children aged 4-5 excess weight

LEARNING

Ensure children have access to good education provision

Raise achievement, aspiration and progress for all

Equip young people for life and work in a strong Medway economy

Focused help to where is needed earlier

- 90-95% sufficiency of school places
- 87% of ALL schools (incl. PRUs) rated Good or Better by Ofsted
- 10% of children who were persistently absent from schoo
 - 46.1% average attainment 8 score
 - 0.02% of children permanently excluded
- 7.8% of LAC who achieve the required standard in GCSE English and Maths
 - 6% of young people who are NEET
 - 60% of care leavers supported into EET each year
- 15% of pupils from state-funded and special schools who entered the most selective HE by age 19
 - 135 Farly Help Assessments started in schools
 - 90% of LAC with a PEP reviewed in the last 6 months
 - 65% of new EHC Plans issued within 20 weeks (excluding exceptions)
