Summary

This item advises Members of the current work programme and allows the Committee to adjust it in the light of latest priorities, issues and circumstances. It gives Members the opportunity to shape and direct the Committee's activities over the year.

1. Budget and Policy Framework

1.1 Under Chapter 4, Part 5 of the Constitution – Overview and Scrutiny Rules, paragraph 21.1 (xv) General terms of reference, each overview and scrutiny Committee has the responsibility for setting its own work programme.

2. Background

2.1 Appendix 1 to this report sets out the proposed work programme for the Committee during the current municipal year.

3. Agenda planning meeting

- 3.1 Members will be aware that Overview and Scrutiny Committees hold agenda planning meetings on a regular basis. These give officers guidance on information that Members wish them to provide when scrutinising an issue. An agenda planning meeting took place on 13 December 2019.
- 3.2 At the meeting it was agreed that an update report on the Ofsted inspection of Medway's Children's Services, scheduled for the January meeting, should, if possible, include the report submitted by the independent Children's Services Commissioner to the Parliamentary under Secretary of State for Children and Families on 2 December 2019. If the report is not published in time for inclusion on the agenda for this meeting a special meeting of the Committee has been suggested rather than delay consideration of the report until March.

- 3.3 It was also recommended that a report on the findings of OFSTED following it's re-visit in December to review Medway's services for children with Special Education Needs and Disabilities should be reported to the March meeting of this Committee (or to a Special meeting if called earlier to consider an update on the OFSTED Inspection of Medway Children's Services).
- 3.4 As part of further work to strengthen the effectiveness of Medway' arrangements for scrutiny of children's services the Chairman of the Committee has expressed an interest in reviewing the arrangements and best practice in one or more other Local Authorities that have been judged by OFSTED to have made good improvement. Officers have been asked to facilitate this and, as appropriate, to set up a visit by the Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Opposition Spokesperson to another local authority for the purpose of bringing back any learning and best practice.
- 3.5 The Portfolio Holder for Adult Services is unable to attend this meeting of the Committee as originally planned. He is able to attend the March meeting instead if this is agreed by Members at the next agenda planning meeting.
