APPLICATION FOR A VARIATION OF PREMISES LICENCE THE BOUNTY PUBLIC HOUSE, BLIGH WAY, STROOD, KENT. ME2 2XH

Summary

The applicant has applied for a variation of the Premises Licence in respect of The Bounty Public House, Bligh Way, Strood, Kent, ME2 2XH.

All responsible authorities have been consulted in line with the Licensing Act.

The application is before Members as representations have been received from the Police. To date no agreement has been reached.

- 1. Budget and policy framework
- 1.1. Medway Council has published its Statement of Licensing Policy, which it takes into account in all applications relating to the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2. The application
- 2.1 In accordance with the Licensing Act 2003, the Council has received an application for a variation of the Premises Licence in respect of the Bounty Public House, Bligh Way, Strood, Kent, ME2 2XH.
- 2.2 The details of the application requirements are as follows:

Remove Condition 16 as there is no children's play area.

Films

To add the playing of films to the licence:-

Monday to Saturday 10:00 to 23:00 Sunday 12:00 to 22:00

Supply of Alcohol

To increase the operating hours of the premises licence of the pub for some days and for religious and seasonal public holidays:-

Monday to Wednesday 10:00 to 23:00 Thursday to Saturday 10:00 to 01:00 Sunday 12:00 to 23:00

Seasonal Variations for the supply of alcohol

New Year's Eve 07:00 to New Year's Day 23:00

St Patrick's Day plus one hour on standard trading time

Easter Bank Holiday Friday to Monday inclusive plus one hour on standard trading time

May Bank Holiday Friday to Monday inclusive plus one hour on standard trading time.

Spring Bank Holiday Friday to Monday inclusive plus one hour on standard trading time

Late Summer Bank Holiday Friday to Monday inclusive plus one hour standard trading time.

Christmas Eve 10:00 – 02:00 Christmas Day 11:00 – 22:30

Boxing Day Friday to Monday inclusive plus one hour on standard trading time.

Opening hours of the premises to be until 30 minutes after the end of licensable activity.

- 2.3 A copy of the current Premises Licence is at Appendix A.
- 2.4 A copy of the original application submitted is at Appendix B.
- 2.5 The application has been correctly advertised in the local press and notices displayed on the premises for the required period.
- 2.6 A copy of a map showing the location of the premises is at Appendix C.

3. Promotion of Licensing Objectives

- 3.1 The applicant is expected to demonstrate that they have dealt with and understand the promotion of the four licensing objectives, where appropriate. Members are referred to section M of the application at Appendix B.
- 3.2 The four licensing objectives are:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder
 - public safety
 - the prevention of public nuisance
 - the protection of children from harm

4. Relevant Representations

4.1 This matter has been put to the Licensing Hearing Panel because the Council has received representations relating to three of the licensing objectives, prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, and prevention of public nuisance from the Police. Copies of these are attached at Appendix D. To date no agreement has been reached.

5. Policy Considerations

- 5.1 Medway Council has published its Statement of Licensing Policy, which it will consider alongside the amended Guidance issued by the Home Office under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 in all applications.
- 5.2 In determining this application, Members may wish to consider information contained in Appendix 7 to the Statement of Licensing Policy that lists examples of good practice against the four licensing objectives as well as Chapters 9 and 10 of the amended Guidance.

6. Risk Management

6.1 The Council has to consider and determine this application, which is a function relating to licensing and registration as set out in Schedule 1 to the Functions Regulations, the Licensing Act 2003, the Gambling Act 2005 and other licensing functions reserved by law to the Council's Licensing and Safety Committee and its Sub-Committees, in accordance with the law (both statutory and case law), relevant statutory guidance and statements of policy.

7. Financial and legal implications

- 7.1 There are no direct financial or legal implications at this time.
- 7.2 This hearing is regulated by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 (as amended).

7.3 There is the possibility of a challenge by way of appeal to the decision by either the applicant or objectors should either have the requisite grounds to do so. Legal advice will be given to Members as appropriate at the meeting. However, whatever the decision of the Panel, this must be based on the evidence placed before it in line with the licensing objectives and the Panel must decide what weight to attribute to this information.

8. Recommendation

8.1 That the Licensing Hearing Panel, having regard to the Licensing Act 2003, the statutory guidance issued under S182, the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and all matters before it, both written and oral, considers and determines this application to vary a premises licence.

Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

Condition 1

No supply of alcohol maybe made under this licence:-

- (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of it or
- (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.

Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Condition 2

Only individuals licensed by the Security Industry Authority (SIA) maybe used at the premises to guard against:-

- (a) Unauthorised access or occupation (e.g. through door supervision)
- (b) Outbreaks of disorder
- (c) Damage

Condition 3

- (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises
 - (a) Games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to
 - (i) Drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol) or
 - (ii) Drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise)
 - (b) Provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) Provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) Selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) Dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

Condition 4

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it reasonably available.

Condition 5

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol

- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature

Condition 6

The responsible person must ensure that:-

- (a) Where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:-
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
- (b) These measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) Where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Condition 7

- (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price, which is less than the permitted price.
- (2) For the purpose of the condition set out in paragraph 1:-
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(6);
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula: $P = D + (D \times V)$ where:
 - (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence:-
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994(7)
- (3) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph (2) would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph

shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

- (4) (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph (2) on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

Condition 8

When regulated entertainment, which generates significant noise, is taking place, doors and windows will be kept shut.

Condition 9

Reproduced or live music is to be set at a level so as not to be audible at the facade of the nearest residential property.

Condition 10

The designated premises supervisor, duty manager or relevant person should assess noise levels on a regular basis, to prevent excessive breakout.

Condition 11

All staff to be trained in all aspects of the licensing legislation and in particular under age sales. It is recommended that records are kept of the nature and frequency of such training.

Condition 12

CCTV cameras installed and maintained with an incorporated recording facility. Recordings to be stored for an appropriate period (generally one month – but to be agreed with Police and Licensing Authority). The CCTV system to be fully operationally throughout the hours that the premises are open for any licensable activities. Recordings to be made available to Police and Local Authority on request.

Condition 13

No drink will be allowed outside after 00:00 (midnight) on any day.

Condition 14

Children under the age of 14 are allowed on the premises until 22:00 (10 pm).

Condition 15

Notices will be displayed throughout the premises stating that children are to be kept under constant supervision by their parents/guardian at all times.


Condition 16

Kent Police are opposed to this variation for the extension of licensable activity and opening hours at the premises

The North Division police licensing team were not contacted by management team of Bounty prior to this application being submitted.

On 22nd November 2019 at approximately 22:30 hrs Kent Police attended the pub as part of a pre-planned operation with police officers and a passive drugs dog. During this operation a person was arrested for possession with intent to supply class A drugs, and another person was cautioned for possession of class B drug. Police found many bags of cocaine where discarded in the garden and in the pub. It appeared to the officers on site that drug use was prolific in this pub.

In the last calendar year, we have had many calls to the premises from which 9 crime reports have been generated, this includes a GBH with intent, actual bodily harm, common assault, public order and threats to kill and the 3 reports from the drugs operation. As recently as 15th February 2020 at 23:39 hrs, police received a call to state 3 males intoxicated in the pub refusing to leave, they were threatening staff and customers, they threw a glass against a window. The males left prior to police arrival.

With the seasonal variations that have been applied for, this would mean that the pub could remain open until 02:30 hours approximately 22 times a year.

Experience would tell us that the risk of violence and the issues with dispersal can increase the later a venue operates. Kent Police believe that such issues would undermine the licensing objectives, namely the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety and the prevention of public nuisance.

Having fully considered the application for variation submitted, it is apparent that the premises does not intend to take any additional steps to promote the licensing objectives to coincide with the proposed later operating hours. The applicant has not considered measures such as; the introduction of SIA door supervisors, a last entry time an anti-drugs policy or a dispersal policy.

I have been a police officer for 15 years during which time I have undertaken a number of roles. For the last 7 years I have worked as part of the Community Safety Unit at Medway Police Station, specialising as a Police Licensing Officer. This role primarily entails the application and enforcement of the Licensing Act 2003.

On Friday 22nd November 2019 I was on duty in uniform working in the Medway area as part of Operation Pilot. The intention of Operation Pilot is to provide reassurance to those socialising in the night time economy. The aim is to prevent incidence of violence and disorder through high profile policing, whilst identifying those involved in the supply and use of illegal drugs in licensed premises.

Around 22:30 hours on Friday 22nd November 2019, I entered the Bounty Public House, Bligh Way, Strood, Rochester along with a number of other officers including one passive police dog. As we approached the front of the premises a couple of customer who were stood directly outside the main door ran back into the pub, shouting "POLICE, POLICE". The alarm was also activated, which in my opinion and experience was done to warn those inside the venue of the immediate presence of police and the dog.

It was apparent that a wake was taking place at the premises, although not all those present were there for that reason. The passive police dog indicated on a number of people inside the pub. All of these were searched and two were found to be in possession of illegal drugs. One person was dealt with for possession of cannabis, whilst the other was arrested on suspicion of being in possession with the intent to supply class A drugs. In general the atmosphere inside the pub was fairly hostile, with the majority of customers and staff present not happy to police officers there.

One area of particular interest to the police dog was the smoking area located to the rear of the pub. As a result of this I requested that staff grant me access to the unused garden area of the pub which this smoking area backs onto. I searched the area around the smoking shelter and found 7 individual wraps of white powder (likely cocaine) in clear deal bags. These were located on the floor directed at the base of the smoking area.

Non were wet or discoloured leading me to believe that they had not been there very long at all and were likely to have been thrown over the fence or passed through the gaps in the smoking area when people realised police were entering the premises. All these items of drugs were pointed out to Designated Premises Supervisor

I entered both the male and female toilet areas of the pub along with the Designated Premises Supervisor. In the bins of the both toilets were empty clear drug packets. I used a cocaine wipe on the toilet seats and in both the male and female toilets both changed colour indicated the presence of cocaine. Again, this was shown to Designated Premises Supervisor who was provided with verbal drug prevention advice.

It is my professional opinion that management and staff at the premises were not sufficiently taking measures to stop or limit the use of illegal substances in the public house.
