Development of the centre will result in closure for an anticipated 18 months. This will mean the temporary loss of Council-run sports facilities in the east of Medway for the duration of the closure. This is most likely to affect groups who may find it difficult/costly to travel elsewhere. Splashes is also popular with senior residents, with approximately half of all free swims undertaken at Medway sports centre in a year being provided at Splashes. Meeting that level of demand at other Medway sports centres would be difficult to achieve (although it is noted that social distancing and safety measures likely to be introduced at sports centres will already impact on this)
