The Council is currently considering options for developing service for people who use the 147 Nelson Road day centre. Options include:

- 1. Maintaining the service as it is
- 2. Amalgamating the service with the Community Outreach Support Service
- 3. Closing the centre but re-providing those with Care Act Eligible needs with personalised support

Evidence has been gathered from the ASC database, visits to the Centre and discussions with the manager and other staff.

All service users have mental health support needs.

They are fairly equally spread across all adult age groups.

Of the 38 existing users for whom ethnicity is recorded, 34 are white British, 4 are Asian

18 are men and 20 are women.

The service is currently delivered an all-female staff. All are White British and none are registered disabled.
