Please could I add a supplement to section M (d) to the premises licence application for The Hop & Rye micropub in Wainscott.

The size of the premises dictates that audiences would always be under 500, so my application for a provision for recorded music and for live music was unnecessary. I would also like to qualify our proposed attitude and actions regarding the potential for music causing public nuisance .

Recorded music would normally be at background level, possibly provided by a juke box. If on occasion recorded music was to be louder, we would ensure all doors and windows were closed to limit noise outside.

No recorded music would be played outside.

We would ensure that it was finished prior to the 10pm closing time.

The request for a provision for live music was aimed at hosting morris dancers, folk singers and possibly jam nights. We would anticipate that all such entertainment would be acoustic. In the event of live music being amplified, we would limit the volume to a sociable level, ensure that it is inside and ensure that all doors and windows remain shut. All live music to be finished prior to the 10pm closing time.
