

GUIDELINES FOR LICENSING HEARING PANELS

The chairman will control the proceedings and the following is a guideline for each hearing but may be adjusted if appropriate.

1. The chairman explains the proposed format for the meeting and asks everyone to introduce themselves.
2. The Licensing Officer briefly outlines the application.
3. The applicant (or their representative) speaks in support of their application and call any witnesses.
4. Objectors* ask the applicant (or their representative) and witnesses questions.
5. The panel asks the applicant (or their representative) and witnesses questions.
6. Objectors* speak about their representation and call any witnesses.
7. The applicant (or their representative) asks the objectors questions.
8. The panel asks questions.
9. All parties are asked if they wish to add anything further.
10. The chairman requests everyone to leave the room in order that the panel may reach a decision. The Legal Officer and Committee Co-ordinator to the panel will remain.



11. Everyone will be invited to return to receive the decision. In the event of complex or lengthy applications, the panel may decide to give its decision at a later date.

* Objectors may include responsible authorities such as the Police, the Fire Brigade, Environmental Health Officers, Development and Building Control Officers, Highway Officers, Trading Standards Officers and local residents. The responsible authorities will be asked to speak first.

1. The application

- 1.1 In accordance with the Licensing Act 2003, the council has received an application for a new premises licence in respect of Byron Stores 34 Byron Road Gillingham

2. Background

- 2.1 As stated at 1.1 this is an application for a new premises licence for the sale of alcohol at Byron Stores, 34 Byron Road Gillingham.

3. Promotion of Licensing Objectives

3.1 The applicant is expected to demonstrate that they have dealt with the promotion of the four licensing objectives, where appropriate. Members are referred to Paragraph P of the application at Appendix A where the applicant has referred to this issue.

3.2 The four licensing objectives are:

- the prevention of crime and disorder
- public safety
- the prevention of public nuisance
- the protection of children from harm

4. Relevant Representations

4.1 This matter has been put to the Licensing Hearing Panel because the council has received relevant representations from members of the public (including a petition) and the police. Copies are attached at Appendix D.

4.2 Appendix E shows the location of members of the public representations in relation to the immediate vicinity of the premises that are the subject of this application.

5. Policy Considerations

5.1 Medway Council has published its Statement of Licensing Policy, which it will consider in all applications. Paragraphs 3, 4, 5 and 6 specifically deal with the question of crime and disorder, public safety, public nuisance and the protection of children from harm, which are the objectives raised in the relevant representations.

This is a new Premises License application.

The business is located in a small parade of shops within a residential street currently it trades as an existing retail premises. This application is for the provision of a premises license for "Off Sales".

The current owner of the business is not the applicant in this application. It is understood that Mr Ratnam Santhirakanthan is in the process of purchasing the business from the current owner.

In preparation for this application I have reviewed systems held by Kent Police in Medway in relation to the premises and the proposed Designated Premises Supervisor additionally I have also spoken to Neighbourhood officers for this area of Medway and the area where Modern News is.

In relation to the Premises that is subject of this application, with the exception of an incident in 2010 when it suffered a robbery there is no information held by Kent Police in Medway in relation to this premises that may assist the licensing panel in their decision making process.

In relation to the applicant and prospective owner, Mr Santhirakanthan is currently the owner and Designate Premises Supervisor for MODERN NEWS (06-Prem-777) 332 High Street Chatham ME4 4NR. Anicdotally, it is suspected that there are causal link between Morden News, drunks and persons who cause public nuisance in the area of Chatham that it occupies.

Kent Police Systems disclose:

- DY/010461/10 refers to an incident on the 27/06/2010 where a known drunk who was drunk and had had alcohol seized from him was seen by Police to attend the premises and was stopped in possession of further alcohol. The sole employee of the premises admitted the sale and admitted that the individual was drunk but served him to avoid confrontation.
- DY/006589/10 refers to an incident on the 26/04/2010 where two males where stopped drinking Alcohol in an Alcohol Control Zone. Both were at the rear of the Gala Bingo Hall, an area frequented by persons who abuse drugs and Alcohol. Both males were later seen to attended Morden News and purchase more alcohol.
- In November 2009 three females (all under 18) were stopped outside Gala Bingo (Chatham) with a number of bottles of WKD (Alcohol) in their possession. They admitted that an unidentified male had purchased the alcohol on their behalf from Morden News.

On page 14 of the application form the applicant has given some consideration to the Licensing Objectives and measures that they intend to adopt as part of their operating schedule to promote these objectives. However it is clear that despite the applicant being a Personal License holder having obtained a personal license in 2006 they are unable to demonstrate or articulate in any detail the steps that they intend to adopt in the promotion of the Licensing Act 2003. This may also demonstrate further weaknesses in their knowledge or may demonstrate apathy. One or both of these reasons may account for the concerns we have with Modern News.

The promotion of the licensing objectives is the key to the Licensing Act 2003 and the responsible retailing of alcohol.

All conditions attached to a Premises License need to be clear and unambiguous ensuring that Designated Premises Supervisor and all employees' are aware of their liabilities and responsibilities in respect of the Licensing Act 2003. This also enables Responsible Authorities to engage and deal with premises and persons in a manner that is bespoke to the needs of the Responsible Authority and those that it represents. Kent Police in Medway ask that the Licensing Committee give consideration to the following representations.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

The promotion of this objective by the imposition of conditions is a key to the Licensing Act 2003. As mentioned earlier, in August 2010 the premises were the target of a knifepoint Robbery. This may have been an opportunist crime influenced by the location of the premises and the possibility that there would have been high cash holding at the premises. The addition of the high value goods such as alcohol may tend to aggravate this vulnerability and undermine the "Crime and Disorder" objective. It is important that conditions are attached to this license that seek effectively promote this objective and minimise the risk of it being undermined.

Public Safety

The promotion of this objective by the imposition of conditions is a key to the Licensing Act 2003. Whilst there are no current concerns specific to "Public Safety" associated with this premises it is important that conditions are attached to this license that seek to promote this objective and minimise the risk of this objective being undermined.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

The promotion of this objective by the imposition of conditions is a key to the Licensing Act 2003. Whilst there are no current concerns specific to "Prevention of Public Nuisance" associated with this premises currently we do have concerns regarding the manner in which the applicant conducts his business and the responsibilities he is expected to discharge. This is demonstrated by anecdotal and recorded intelligence around the service of drunks associated with his other premises Modern News. It is important that conditions are attached to this license that seek to promote this objective and minimise the risk of this objective being undermined.

Protection of Children

The promotion of this objective by the imposition of conditions is a key to the Licensing Act 2003. Whilst there are no current concerns specific to "Protection of Children" associated with this premises currently we do have concerns regarding the manner in which the applicant conducts his business and the responsibilities he is expected to discharge. This is demonstrated by anecdotal and recorded intelligence around the service of children associated with his other premises Modern News. It is important that conditions are attached to this license that seek to promote this objective and minimise the risk of this objective being undermined. It is important that conditions are attached to this License that seek to promote this objective.

Suggested Conditions that could be added to the licence to remedy the representation or other suggestions the Licensing Sub Committee may take into account:

1. The D.P.S must be present when any sales of Alcohol take place.
2. When the premises are open to the public or a section of the public C.C.T.V is to be used to continually monitor the Licensed Premises.
3. The C.C.T.V must give clear and unobstructed views of all areas of the premises where alcohol is displayed, the till area and the 1st point of public access. The positioning of these camera's must be agreed with the Licensing Officer for Kent Police In Medway.
4. The range of the images that any C.C.T.V camera provides must be agreed with the Licensing Officer for Kent Police In Medway.
5. No material changes may be made in respect of conditions 3 & 4 without prior written authority of the Licensing Officer for Kent Police In Medway.
6. CCTV to be installed to a standard agreed by police and in accordance with CCTV Code of Practice. The system is to be maintained and serviced on a regular basis; a physical and auditable record of this is to be kept on the premises and must be available when practicable for examination by Police and officers of the local authority. The system must incorporate a recording facility and must be fully operational throughout the hours that the premise is open for licensable activity. All recordings must to be stored for a minimum of one calendar month and access to these recordings must be made available to Police and Local Authority officers upon request when the request is reasonable and practicable. All staff will be fully trained in the use of the CCTV system including the retrieval of stored or recorded data. Throughout the hours that the premises are open for licensable activities, a minimum of one member of staff is to be on duty who upon request of the Police or an officer of the local authority can provide a copy of any stored or recorded data in a form that can be taken away and viewed at another location.
7. All staff, employed in a paid or unpaid capacity are to receive training in relation to the conditions applicable to this premises and training specific to their role as per the Licensing Act 2003. Individual documented training records are to be kept on the premises and shall include the nature, content and frequency of all and any training. These records will be made available for inspection by any Police Officer, Police Licensing Officer and Officer of the Local Authority or Trading Standards when practicable.

8. Where a person appears to be under the age of eighteen they will be required to provide a proof of age. The only acceptable proof of age will be;
 - Passport.
 - Photo Driving License
 - Pass approved ID Cards

9. Incidents records are to be kept by the License Holder. These records will be kept in a bound book and will detail the following;
 - Day, date and Time of incident.
 - Nature of the incident
 - Resolution
 - Each entry is to be checked and signed by the D.P.S on the day of the event.

10. The License Holder will keep a written refusal book. These records will be kept in a bound book and detail the following;
 - Day, Date and Time of Refusal.
 - Nature of Refusal and reason.
 - Details of or description of the individual.
 - Each entry is to be checked and signed by the D.P.S on the day of the event.

11. Anyone employed in a paid or unpaid capacity at the premises must undertake training in conflict management.

I am writing this letter out of concern for the above.

I have been notified by the local newsagent of the above proposal and am deeply concerned about this.

The main reason I am concerned is because of the potential increase of anti social behaviour in the area. Over recent months there has been an increase of anti social behaviour in this area and young people potentially having access to alcohol will just increase the level of crime. I work part time for Gillingham Youth For Christ (a local youth organisation) and at our evening drop in sessions we quite often have a group of young people come in from the Byron Road area. Potentially these young people could be served alcohol and that brings alarm bells to myself. We have spent a while trying to help these young people and would not like to think they would go backwards in their behaviour because alcohol is being provided.

The argument of course would be that the newsagent on Byron Road sell alcohol but having known the owners for a little while now, I am very confident they know a lot of the young people and would recognise an under age person trying to purchase alcohol and would not allow it.

One other area of concern is of course the parking. Parking has increasingly got worse in this area over the past few months and an off licence put in place would increase the level of parking (double parking as well). Emergency services use these local roads and double parking (just to purchase alcohol) could block an emergency vehicle and could be a matter of life and death if they cannot get past a car which is double parked.

We wish to object to the above application on the following grounds:


