1 Summary description of the proposed change What is the change to policy / service / new project that is being proposed?

How does it compare with the current situation?

The development of an Early Help strategy in Medway to ensure a multiagency, joined up approach that strengthens the early help offer for children and their families.

In November 2020, the Early Help Partnership Board was established to drive forward a multi-agency approach that would strengthen our offer to families across Medway and ensure that children and families receive early support.

The draft strategy has been coproduced across the multi-agency partnership.

A multi-agency workshop was held in December 2020 to support the development of the Early Help Strategy, over eighty partners attended. It was at this event that the partnership developed the vision and the common set of principles included within the strategy.

Further consultation across the partnership took place in the spring, to ensure all views were considered and incorporated where relevant.
