- 1 Summary description of the proposed change
- What is the change to policy/service/new project that is being proposed?
- How does it compare with the current situation?

As a result of a number of transport appeals to the School Transport and Curriculum Appeals Committee from parents whose children had acquired a place at a grammar school on an independent admission appeal, but who did not pass the Medway Test, the committee recommended that the Cabinet is asked to consider whether an amendment be made to the policy where pupils who secure a place at a Medway Grammar School on appeal should also be classed as grammar ability under the Education Travel Assistance Policy and therefore entitled to travel assistance under the same criteria. Under the current policy, only those pupils who passed the Medway Test would be eligible.

The proposal is to add in a sentence to section 1.4c of the policy (Shown in bold below):

For secondary age pupils, Medway Council also take into account whether a child is of grammar ability (under the Medway Test assessment procedures or admitted to a Medway grammar school following an independent admission appeal) or non-grammar ability. For grammar assessed pupils a Medway grammar school will be considered as the nearest suitable qualifying school.

Amending the Travel Assistance Policy will mean that pupils attending a Medway grammar school will be treated the same when they apply for travel assistance whether they gained a place under the Medway Test assessment or following an independent admission appeal.

A period of consultation was undertaken between 19 April 2021 to 30 May 2021. During this time no responses were received. Whilst this is a disappointing response, despite the wide ranging circulation of the consultation document, it is not entirely unexpected given the circumstances around these proposals. The amendments will only make the process fairer for pupils and minimal pupils will be impacted.
