- c) Consider and approve minor changes to the Plan for the purpose of presentation or improving clarity

Decision

It has been decided to formally adopt the Kent Downs AONB Management Plan Review (2021-26) in line with the agreement of all partner local authorities and the AONB Joint Advisory Committee, with effect from 16 November 2021.

Reasons for Decision

The adoption of the Kent Downs AONB Management Plan Review was subject to any minor amendments arising from consideration at decision making stage by other local authority partners.

The Kent Downs AONB Joint Advisory Committee met on 9 November 2021 and confirmed that all partner local authorities had agreed to adopt the management plan without amendments.

The Joint Advisory Committee confirmed the decision to adopt the AONB management plan review with effect from 16 November 2021.

The Kent Downs AONB management plan is a statutory requirement. The AONB Unit prepares and reviews the management plan on behalf of the local authority partners. The management plan needs to be formally adopted by individual local authorities.
