The proposals will result in three single gender grammar schools to coeducational from September 2024. This will provide equal opportunity for boys and girls in Medway to access a grammar school. There will be no additional places overall, but a fairer splt of places and increased availability for medway pupils.

8 week consultation period to wide range of stakeholders. 67 responses received 48% objecting, 46 % approving and 6% neutral. There were various and numerous comments made in the responses and these can be found within the outcomes of consultation report which this DIA accompanies as appendix 3. The three schools involved submitted letters of support for the proposals as did the North Kent and Medway MAT CEO group, indicating that senior education leaders fully support the proposals.

The proposals are intended to promote a fairer and more equitable system for pupils to acquire a grammar school place in Medway. The proposals will benefit Medway resident pupils as the changes will provide a greater opportunity to access grammar education. There may be some religious groups who prefer single sex education for their children, but there will continue to be girls and boys only schools in Medway in both the selective and non selective sectors. Overall the changes proposed are expected to be positive.
