



June Assurance Report

The opportunity to recommence sports delivery has been received well amongst staff and boys. 89 different boys have been involved and 193 attendances in total during exercise sessions on the 3G. We launched the restart with a visit from Danny Fenner and Pete Augustine from the FA who are the latest organisation that will look to support resettlement. We will continue to grow this relationship and have embedded their qualification support into our education delivery.

We were delighted to welcome our new ambassador Marilyn Okoro OLY from Team GB into the estate on Friday 11th June. She took boys from Cedar and the A2 landing for a technical session as well as hosting a Q+A whilst showcasing her Olympic Bronze medal. She will be joining us again in the coming months to support further projects.

The Cedar project took a two-week break to enable some project planning to take place and look at how we can continue to support the community values. We have restarted the sessions with the launch of a community sports club that will use the community to help create a club. The boys will gain ownership and responsibility for the club in its entirety including managing the structure, equipment and strategic direction. It will take time to progress to the required level and we have been supporting the Health and Well-being team to facilitate its growth.

Interviews and filming for the digital prisons service took place with the B2 landing on the Astro turf. We are awaiting the draft of this to be launched and are currently creating digital resources that will map to our education programmes as well as supporting external coaching qualifications and resettlement opportunities.



Resettlement work has progressed well and four boys have accessed our community site for ROTL opportunities across a range of vocations. They have taken part in gym classes, sports coaching, driving theory revision, grounds work, business admin and undertaken an inspirational talk with Marilyn. Using our online learning platform, two boys have achieved qualifications that include manual handling, COSHH, fire safety as well as four others which they can take into any workplace with them. We have aligned one of the boys who wishes to undertake a career in arboriculture with our grounds team and wants the above induction is completed we will enrol him onto his level 1 turf management course. We have worked closely with NOVUS education to effectively support the assessment and achievement of a gym level 2 qualification. He is due to progress to an open estate next month and we will be looking to progress him to work alongside one of our community partners personal training business and potentially complete his PT Level 3 qualification. We were joined by staff from Feltham YOI who observed the gym practice taking place and had a look around our community site.

In the community we attended an EHCP annual review for one boy released last month. We have left the meeting with him considering a gym-based programme and the opportunity to re-sit his CSCS at heights training course. Another boy we have been supporting has also continued to perform well and is restarting work this month and he has continued to send through picture of his project work. We have been invited to another boy's annual review next month to look at how we can support his education full time from September.
