RIVER STRATEGY PROGRESS UPDATE

Summary

This report provides an update and presentation on the SQW commission to produce a River Strategy and to consider progress so far.

- 1. Budget and policy framework
- 1.1. Work on the production of a River Strategy is being completed as part of a suite of strategies associated with Medway 2037.
- 2. Background
- 2.1. Over the last two decades Medway Council has produced a number of strategies associated with the River Medway.
- 2.2. SQW were commissioned in October 2021 to produce an updated River Strategy that would include a review of what had been produced before and also a comprehensive assessment of current issues and opportunities associated with the both the River Medway and the Borough's Thames frontage.
- 2.3. It is anticipated that the strategy's cross cutting themes will influence many areas of the Council's service delivery as well as acting as a focus for all partners and stakeholders associated with the rivers running through and bordering the Borough.
