446 Screening of complaint CCC/2022/009

Discussion:

The Monitoring Officer introduced the report which set out the details of a complaint relating to the conduct of a Medway Councillor. He explained that he had undertaken initial screening as part of the authority delegated to him by the Committee to initially screen complaints and he had concluded that it was not appropriate for him, as Monitoring Officer, to determine that no further action be taken. The matter had therefore been referred to the Committee.

He added that he had attempted an informal resolution between the two parties, as documented in the papers, but that this had been unsuccessful.

The Committee debated the issue and considered that a second attempt at an informal resolution was the most favourable outcome for both parties, should that be successful. This was a view supported by the Independent Person. During the discussion it was suggested that the Monitoring Officer contact all Members to remind them of the expectations of them in relation to their actions on social media, particularly as the Council was leading into a pre-election period, which he undertook to do.

Decision:

The Committee agreed to request the Monitoring Officer to make a conditional offer of informal resolution by requesting the subject member to apologise more formally to the complainant and to remove the relevant posts on social media. Should the subject member not accept to undertake these actions then the matter would be referred for investigation.
