Prevention of crime and disorder, Public Safety and Prevention of Public Nuisance	Yes	The premises licence was granted to Nsibidi Limited on 3 August 2020 of which Mr Kingsley Atuanya is the Director. He is also the Designated Premises Supervisor and as such is responsible for the day to day running of the Premises and ensuring compliance with the conditions attached to the Premises Licence and upholding the Licensing Objectives.  A written warning was given to Mr Atuanya on 29 <sup>th</sup> November 2022 following confirmation that there were no door supervisors in attendance on Saturday 12 November 2022.  Under section 136 of the Licensing Act 2003 a person commits an offence if he/she carries on a licensable activity on or from the premises otherwise or in accordance with an authorisation; or if he/she knowingly allows a licensable activity to be so carried on. A person convicted of such an offence is liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or an unlimited fine, or to both.
		An officer from licensing visited the premises with Kent Police on 3 March 2023 at approximately 20:15hrs and

		there was only one door supervisor on duty at that time.  Condition 18 of the premises licence states:  "On Friday/Saturday/Christmas Eve/ New Year's Eve and bank holidays, there will be a minimum of 2 SIA door supervisors on duty from 20:00 until closure of the premises and all members of the public have left. For any other event, the designated premises supervisor will complete a written risk assessment in respect of the provision of door supervisors. If deemed necessary, a minimum of 2 SIA registered door supervisors will be employed at the premises."  The door supervisor present stated that only he works on a Friday night.  The Police Officer and I went inside the premises where the manager of the Premises said the other door supervisor was on his break. When asked when he was due to come back off his break, the manager replied that he had been delayed in starting work that evening, but was on route.  The Police Officer visited again later that evening and confirmed the other door supervisor was present.  Licensing support the application for a review of the Premises Licence as the Licensee and DPS has failed to promote the Licensing Objectives by failing to comply with Condition 18 attached to the Premises Licence on two separate occasions.
