A 6 week consultation with the trade, Medway Councillors and the public was undertaken. 153 responses were receive from the trade with 47 agreeing with the policy change, 73 objecting and 3 not specifying their option. 20 responses were received from Councillors; all agreeing to the policy change. No responses were received from the public.
