There are lots of small alleyways in the area and drunks often wander down private lanes to relieve themselves I am concerned that an extension of licencing hours to this venue combined with live entertainment could only worsen the problem that the area is already facing

Prevention of public nuisance	Yes	Amala Buka has previously held live music events that have been very loud and have run until very late.
		This has caused a lot of disturbance for neighbours and their guests. I stay at *** High street, and on many occasions Amala Buka have played very loud music past 11pm. On one occasion this went on until around 1 am.
		The venue have turned the volume down when asked, but when the door to their patio is open the music is much louder.
		I am concerned that the venue does not have adequate noise proofing to hold live music events without disturbing local residents
		The music seems to be amplified through a speaker system, which seems unnecessary given the small size of the venue. There's no need for music that loud when the restaurant is just a single small room.

Please suggest any conditions that you think could be added to the licence to remedy your representations or other suggestions you would like the Licensing Sub Committee to take into account		It would be preferable if music could be kept to a reasonable volume and finish at a reasonable time such as 11pm and not 1am as it has previously. This is far too late to be playing music in a residential area. Some additional soundproofing to the venue would be appreciated. This is a very small venue with a patio seating area and a lot of noise bleeds into the surrounding area when the doors are left open.
		The venue does not really need to amplify music via loud speakers as the room is small
		Clientele also need to be mindful of local residents, and keep their voices down when leaving at late hours so as to not contribute to existing problems with social disorder
