894 Screening of Complaint CCC/2025/003

Discussion:

The Monitoring Officer introduced the report which set out the details of a complaint relating to the conduct of a Medway Councillor. He explained that in his absence, the Deputy Monitoring Officer had undertaken initial screening as part of the authority delegated by the Committee to initially screen complaints and she had concluded that it was not appropriate for her, as Deputy Monitoring Officer, to determine that no further action be taken. The matter had therefore been referred to the Committee.

The Committee considered the allegations, having regard to the complaint, as set out in and attached to the Committee report. The Committee's assessment was undertaken with the Screening Process the Committee has adopted for this purpose.

The Committee determined that the allegations made in the complaint could potentially breach of the Member Code of Conduct.

Decision:

The Committee agreed to instruct the Monitoring Officer to conduct an investigation of complaint CCC/2025/003, the outcome of which would be reported to a future meeting of the Committee.
